### 'Popstars the 90s Musical' The Arts at Kadina Memorial

#### From the Principal's Desk

Students actively involved in 'The Arts' often have gains in maths, reading, writing and critical thinking.

At Kadina Memorial School we offer a diverse Arts program, starting from reception with basic rhythm, rhyme, singing and dance progressing to specialty areas such as choir, instrumental music, creative arts and drama productions.

Next week Kadina Memorial will present 'Popstars the 90s Musical' at Wallaroo Town Hall, Wednesday 20 September and Thursday 21 September, at 6.30pm.

This is an exciting opportunity for more than 30 students from Years 5 to 12, as well as staff to bring together singing and dancing talents with their musicianship to produce the musical.

An archive search suggests this is possibly the School's first big drama production on stage since the 1990s, certainly since the amalgamation. It's ironic then the musical is based on the 1990s music scene, an era well before students' time!

The production is the result of a year's work so far, with rehearsals during and after school as well as on weekends and with a number of staff making cameo appearances on stage!

I encourage the school community to support the production with tickets available from the Finance Office, \$15 adult and \$10 for children, or at the door unless sold out.

A visit to rehearsals on the weekend reconfirms to me why The Arts is so important in education.

- Provides a purpose for learning
- Is multi-sensory
- Encourages students to collaborate and be respectful of others
- Is an engaging way to learn
- Develops social, creative, cognitive and physical development.



From facials, massages, craft and puzzles to a kick of the football, dads, grandpas and caregivers were given a lot of attention! And clearly they look more relaxed for it!


