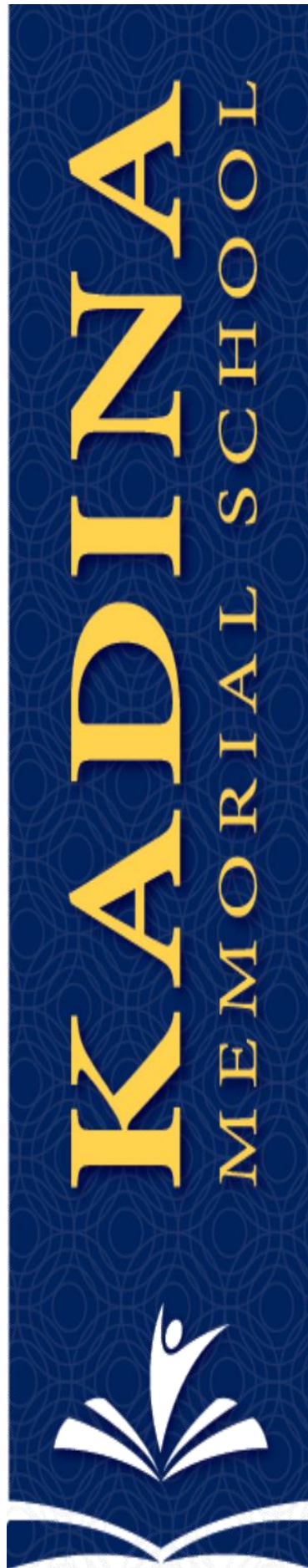
Success and acknowledgement in any field is a result of hard work, setbacks along the way, support from those around you, a dogged determination to achieve and a passion for what you do.

## Class Placements for 2017

Don't forget to let us know, in writing, if your child will not be attending Kadina Memorial School next year. Also, if you have family or friends moving to the district and who definitely want to enrol their children here, please let us know so they can be considered in class placements.

We would like as much information about 2017 numbers as possible so we can structure the classes according to student needs.

For Year 2-6 students, placing students in classes involves considering the teachers' knowledge about their learners and students indicating their best learning buddies. Families have the opportunity to share information about their child's learning strengths/needs and friendship groups that will assist us to make informed placement decisions. This year for current Year 2-6 students we are using a computer program to combine this information and develop first draft placements on the Pupil Free Day.

**Family information, in writing, is required by Friday 11 November to Mrs Debbie Terrett.** We receive numerous (and sometimes conflicting requests) and do our best to place students in a supportive and productive learning environment.

For Year 7-9 students, provide a written request with any information you would like considered. It needs to be a genuine request relating to your child/ren's academic, social, physical or emotional needs. Sometimes there are instances where it has not been possible to meet these requests for a number of reasons. Alternatively, make a time soon to see either Debbie Terrett (R-6) or Tarryn Germein (7-9) regarding your child's needs.

## Parent/Caregiver Reminders

### Visits to child's class during the day

In the interest of student safety, we remind all families that if you come onto the school ground during the day you are required to sign in at the Front Office. Please do not go straight to your child's class nor approach them in the yard without signing in first.

Your cooperation in this will help us maintain the safest possible environment at all times for all KMS students.

### Student messages

We encourage families to be as organised as possible and make arrangements in regards to their children's activities prior to them leaving for the school day.

If arrangements do change during the day, we do encourage you to contact the Front Office before 12 o'clock so we can get your message to your child's teacher and to your child. In a school of this size it is very difficult if we get messages just prior to the end of a school day.

Your support in this matter is greatly appreciated.



## Front of school pick-up

We are continuing to monitor parents using the drop off zone at the front of the school. Keeping to the three minutes is critical to ensure all parents have equal ability to be able to pick up their children safely from the front of the school.

We would also like to thank those families who are parking further away, walking to the school and picking up children and walking back to their vehicle. Parking is available at the front of the tennis courts and also the 'Park and Walk' area at the CCSLC.

We have also instructed students not to cross the road between Hallett and Day Street, and to either use the school crossing or cross the road safely by the Hospitality Centre. Students attending the Homework Centre will be the only ones allowed to cross Doswell Terrace in front of the main building.

We are continuing to work with the local Council and SAPOL to improve the safety and efficiency of this pick-up area.

Term 4 means hats back on for all students whilst in the sun, please ensure your child has the school approved bucket hat. These can be purchased from Sportspower and we do keep some hats at the school which can be purchased from the Finance Office.

# Sub School News

## R-6 Corner - Coding at KMS

We live in a world surrounded by technology and we know that whatever path our students choose to go into as adults, their ability to succeed will increasingly focus on understanding how technology works. The aim of teaching coding in schools is to equip students with the skills they need for the world of work, inspire more young people to pursue careers in computing and help them to problem solve and become logical thinkers.

Over the last two terms some classes have been working with David Easter our E-Learning teacher to bring the exciting world of coding and robotics into the Primary Years. With the R-2 students beginning to use Bee Bots as part of their Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths and the 3-6 cohort using Edison Robots.

Robotics is a way of teaching students to create and use code to program robots to move in different directions, make sounds or flash lights. By controlling a physical robot and seeing what goes wrong, students learn how to debug and rewrite code to be successful.

## Unit News

Welcome back to Term 4. I would like to share some information about Modified SACE and how students at KMS are able to achieve their Modified SACE Certificate.

Since Modified SACE was introduced in the KMS Unit in 2011, a number of students have been supported to achieve their SACE Certificate using Modified Subjects. Senior students in the C4 Small class are also working towards this achievement having already completed a number of subjects last year. Our current Year 12 students Matthew Lyons and Tyson Lodge are completing their Research Project about their transition from school to work at Bedford Wallaroo. Weekly Work Experience visits enabling a seamless and positive transition when they leave school are the focus of the projects.

Modified subjects are designed to allow students with identified intellectual disabilities to demonstrate their learning in a range of challenging and achievable learning experiences.

Modified subjects allow students to develop their capabilities and personal learning goals. Students learn how to identify, develop, and achieve their personal learning goals in the context of the subject undertaken. To do this, students need the support of teachers, parents/carers, and other people in their lives.

Students are eligible to enrol in modified subjects if they have identified intellectual disabilities and will not be able to reach the performance standards in mainstream subjects because of their intellectual functioning and adaptive behaviour.

A student's achievement in a modified subject is reported on the SACE Record of Achievement as 'completed' with the appropriate number of credits. Students who complete all the requirements of the SACE using modified subjects will be awarded a SACE Certificate, which carries the explanation: 'This student has fulfilled the requirements of this qualification using modified subjects.'

We would like to share a few photos from our Term 3 R-6 Assembly where we celebrated learning milestones, event reports, and heard from guest speakers.

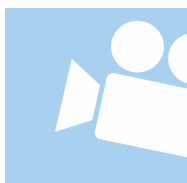


Above, PALS – Play at Lunchtime leaders were awarded their certificates and badges.




## Mystic rose
