Keeping holiday learning alive!

Holidays can be a great time for children - and teachers - to rest and for families to encourage different learning within their homes. Summer holidays are a wonderful opportunity for families to enjoy activities together. Children return to school from the long holiday more mature and keen for the new year after weeks of close contact with family and friends.

Without, however, some attention to learning, the summer weeks of down-time can bring problems later, when teachers have to spend time re-teaching concepts students have forgotten.

The summer break can be especially difficult for younger children who have only recently become used to the daily school routine. They are new learners, and the new skills and routines take a lot of reinforcement, so it's harder for them to come back after the break and start up again where they left off.

Parents may like to spend a short time each day going over some of the things their children have learned at school. Make it fun, but also help to reinforce what children have been learning. Enjoyable activities with letters and numbers and reading a lot can help keep learning alive.

There are many educational activities families can do to help make the transition back to school easier. Cooking, shopping and reading, planning activities, working out costs, making phone calls, writing thankyou letters are all very important to keep children engaged so their minds stay fresh for when they return to school.

Try using the newspaper as a learning tool, even with younger students. They can find the items you need in supermarket advertisements. Get them to circle words they recognise in stories or photo captions.

Take children for small day trips that are fun, educational and energetic. Buy postcards so they can write to friends and grandparents about what they have seen and done.

Playing cards and board games can keep children engaged in reading, cooperating and learning skills.

Craft is also a hands-on way to encourage fine motorskills, creativity and problem-solving! Thank you to the families who gave a helping hand in the 2TK and 2JS Christmas craft afternoon this year.

R-6 Corner

Be brave: to participate, learn and improve.

R-6 students have in 2016 learnt about being brave: to participate, try new learning, persist and solve problems, talk about their learning, speak up about something they don't feel comfortable with or walk away from someone rather than arguing or fighting. They have learnt about their brains, how they function and what helps them to be the best learner they can be.

A particular focus has been exploring what it takes to be a successful mathematician. Brave mathematicians approach their learning with a growth, "I can do this' approach, relish problems: tackling them with energy, persist at challenging times, talk about their learning and constantly improve their skills and understandings.

Years 3-6 students explored setting goals, learning lots about achievement requiring persistence and bravery to honestly reflect on what has helped/hindered their learning.

Reception to Year 2 programs have through play opportunities in combination with small group and whole class explicit teaching, seen students' skills and understandings improve.

Through their performing arts learning students practise being brave when performing at school assemblies, the end of year showcase, 'The Music is Fun Band' show, the Kadina Show and other local events and for our choir performing as part of the 500-member choir at the Festival Theatre.

Our student leaders: the KMSC team led by Shayla Herbert, class mentors and the Play at Lunch (PAL) leaders, bravely step into the unknown to lead at assemblies, meet over lunchtime and ensure new members to our school feel safe and comfortable so they can learn.

The Year 6 camp to Illawonga and excursions to local venues or further afield require students to plan, communicate, take risks and apply their understandings to subsequent reading, writing and maths.

Most importantly every day in so many ways in the nineteen R-6 classes students make the most of every minute of every day to be brave, participate and improve. Their courage is commendable and ensures they build vital and critical life skills.

Students are assisted by their clever class and specialist teachers, our supportive SSO team, super School Counsellor Zelly Ritter, terrific Teaching and Learning Coordinators Sallyanne McNicholl and Kylie Williams, nifty Numeracy Support Teacher Helen Skinner, remarkable Reading Support Teacher Barb Ludwig and their positive parents.

As the year draws to a close we farewell Jen and Justin Nicoll from Canada who have been on exchange this year and became a special part of our world and Barb Ludwig and Tess Newbery who are retiring from teaching. Unit News




