A successful Parents in Education (PIE) grant has enabled the common Making Maths Memorable workshops for preschool and junior primary children's families to be held throughout the NYP Partnership at different times with families able to attend at any location. Exploring 'trusting the count', the foundation understanding required for all number learning, is the focus of these informal workshops. As the most effective way for students to learn this is through play based activities and number games a substantial goody bag of resources is provided for each person attending. ## Year 7 Artwork

We share with you a stunning piece of artwork from Year 7 student Carlo Ammirato. His task was based on the artwork of Howard Arkley. Students learnt basic colour theory learning to mix primary, secondary and tertiary colours. Acrylic painting techniques such as flat colour, blended tone, scumbling, and washes were also used. Watercolour painting techniques such as wet on dry, wet on wet, cauliflowers and masking were studied. Students also used overlay techniques on base coat colours using frottage (a fancy word for crayon rubbings) and stencilling (using the pattern from paper doilies or onion bags).

## Open Boys Knock Out Cricket

KMS Open Boys travelled to Balaklava to play against Horizon Christian School for Round 1. After winning the toss and choosing to bat, KMS was able to get off to a solid start through Fraser McCracken (58 runs) and Dillon Martin (37 runs). Both openers were able to make it to the drinks break where the plan was to come back out and lift the run rate. Dillon Martin was dismissed on the first ball back, breaking the opening partnership of 80. Regular wickets then fell as KMS looked to score quickly with wickets in hand. A late cameo from Lachlan Elliot helped take the KMS score to 129 after the allocated 28 overs.

KMS' bowling attack looked shaky at first with Sam Taylor's three wides in the first over. Luckily he managed to find his line and with the help of opening partner Chad Wuttke, was able to bowl tightly, restricting the opposition's ability to score. Horizon were never really in the contest, but managed to bat out their overs, scoring 7/100. Ben Dunk and Lachlan Elliot both took two wickets.

In our Round 2 match, KMS travelled to Clare High School. KMS chose to bat first and got off to a less than favourable start, losing early wickets and struggling to 6/40 at drinks. A solid partnership from Harry Platten (37 runs) and Lachlan Elliot (14 runs) helped develop a platform for Bailey McNicholl (17 runs) to cash in towards the end of the innings. From its 30 overs, KMS finished all out for 106.

KMS needed to take early wickets to make a game of it. With the score at $2 / 15$, it looked as though the game was evenly balanced. However, a couple of steady partnerships helped Clare to reach the target with relative ease in the end, finishing at 5/110 after 20 overs. Chad Wuttke and Leyhton Hann both picked up 2 wickets.

Overall, the team displayed plenty of talent with the bat and ball. While it was unfortunate to get knocked out, all players gave their best effort and played the game in good spirit.

Step 1: Have the Book Club Catalogue close by and either sign-in or register your account

Step 2: Add your child's first name and last initial (so the school knows who the book is for) then select your school and your child's class e.g. 3BG, 6KW.

Step 3: Click on order and enter the item number from the Book Club catalogue.

Step 4: All orders are linked to your school for submission to Scholastic. Books will still be delivered to the school Library and then onto your child's classroom if you order by the close date.
