# Mrs Daphne Spry (nee Simmons)

On behalf of Kadina Memorial School I send my condolences to Mrs Daphne Spry's family on her recent passing, aged one week short of 107 years.

Mrs Spry was an original Kadina Memorial High School scholar when the site opened its doors for business in 1924. She went on to become a teacher with posts locally, on Southern Yorke Peninsula and Eyre Peninsula.

She had a remarkable teaching career during a period of Australian history which was often at odds with many of her female contemporaries.



Mrs Spry recently contributed to the Kadina Memorial High School History Book, providing an authentic insight into education of another era.

Her legacy continues with the fourth generation of her family attending Kadina Memorial.

At Kadina Memorial School learning comes in many shapes and sizes and one of our big pushes has been connection with the community. In a country area one of the easiest ways to get involved in the community is through sport. Some of the many other benefits of sport participation for children include:

- reduced risk of obesity
- increased cardiovascular fitness
- healthy growth of bones, muscles, ligaments and tendons
- improved coordination and balance
- a greater ability to physically relax and, therefore, avoid the complications of chronic muscular tension (such as headache or backache)
- improved sleep
- mental health benefits, such as greater confidence
- improved social skills
- improved personal skills, including cooperation and leadership.

Reducing inactivity may be more effective in achieving overall increases in energy levels in young children than putting the emphasis on increasing involvement in sporting activities. Taking steps to reduce children's sedentary time is important. To assist families with the cost of joining a local sporting club the Government of South Australia has an initiative of The Sport Vouchers program that provides an opportunity for primary school age children from Reception to Year 7 to receive up to a \$50 discount on sports membership/registration fees. It was great to see such large numbers of people support the students while they had the chance to showcase their hard work.

# MedSpace Workshop

During the first week of the holidays five Kadina Memorial School senior students participated in a MedSpace Workshop in Adelaide.

Brooke Dayman, Jaimee Luck, Nicole Christy, Isobel Fuss and Chloe Martin attended the free three-day workshop, which is aimed to help students prepare for and learn more about the process of studying medicine.

The first day involved a series of slideshows and talks. We learnt what it was like to move from the country to the city and how to prepare for the UMAT – a test that all pre-med students are required to take. This day was very helpful and set us up for the rest of the workshop. That night we had an awesome quiz night and met lots of new friends.

The second day was more hands-on. We visited Flinders University and walked around the campus, looking in the anatomy museum and learning how to apply to Flinders and what their medical course involves. We then drove to Victor Harbor and tried lots of awesome activities in the Flinders hospital campus — we performed CPR on dummies, put real plaster casts on each other, tested our blood pressure and talked to rural medical students.

The last day was the best. We visited the University of Adelaide and learnt more about what it would be like to study at Adelaide Uni and how to become real doctors. We delivered a baby from a mannequin called Lucinda and helped a five year old asthmatic child, both of whom spoke and had simulated heartbeats and other lifelike symptoms. Lucinda even had simulated contractions! We also had a competition to see which group could perform CPR on mannequins and resuscitate them the most successfully.

During the workshop we stayed at Immanuel College. The food and the accommodation were awesome, and we all met many new friends we still keep in contact with and had an amazing time. The workshop was very successful and inspired many of us to become doctors, and we definitely recommend this experience to anyone that is thinking about having a career in medicine or is unsure of what they want to do.
