From the Principal's Desk

At a Remembrance Day Assembly on Friday Kadina Memorial School community paused for a minute's silence as a sign of respect for the men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice in World War One and subsequent conflicts.

Stage 1 History students led the assembly at the base of the flagpoles with invited guests from the Returned Services League and Copper Coast Vietnam Veteran's Association, Governing Council and Parent Club attending.

Instrumental Music teacher Mr Dom Meehan played 'Amazing Grace' on his bagpipes during the wreath laying ceremony. Veterans saying it was a stirring occasion with 'the bagpipes is a very emotional instrument for a soldier'.

In the lead-up to Remembrance Day, senior students spent time with younger peers explaining the School's 'memorial' legacy as well as discussing the names of armed service personnel listed on our Memorial Wall. Younger students were intrigued by the stories belonging to the names with many finding their own surname, sparking questions whether this was a relative.

Remembrance Day on November 11 is a memorial day to acknowledge the end of hostilities when the Armistice was signed on the 11th hour between Germany and the Allies. Thank you to all staff and students

involved in the assembly and catering for a morning tea. It was a very moving event. Student Council representatives also attended official Remembrance Day Services on Saturday, placing wreaths at the base of the epitaphs.

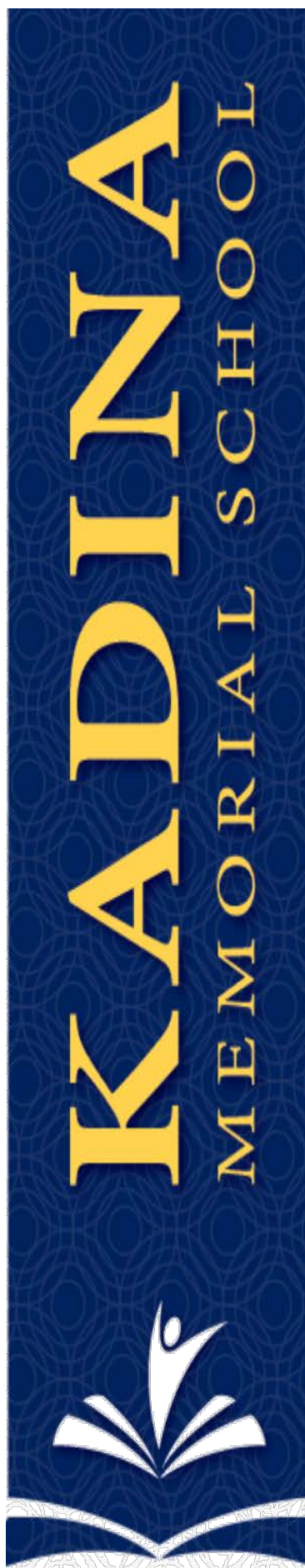

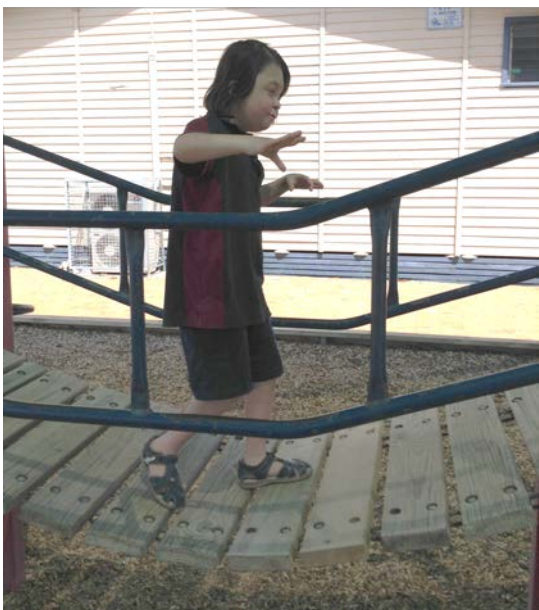
Sub School News

Senior students have enjoyed their weekly walk to the shops to buy items as part of their Shopping Program, visiting the Community Library to borrow books, and collecting recycling containers three times a week from their recycling baskets. They also have the opportunity to walk around the ovals, play on the playgrounds and participate in sport lessons to practise their ball skills. This term they have been learning cricket skills and have engaged in these lessons to improve their catching, bowling and batting, whilst having fun.



The Art of Giving

The ideas were simple, the response overwhelming, and actions louder than words.

Thank you to Kadina Memorial School students and their families for donating non-perishable food towards two simultaneous projects to help others in need.

As part of the Middle School's Student Representative Council Anti-Poverty Awareness Day the Salvation Army met with Year 7-9 students to discuss homelessness, possible factors contributing towards poverty and positive actions to help others less fortunate. The talk was thought provoking requiring students to calculate how they would survive on a minimum of \$36 a day.

The call to action was to donate one non-perishable food item which would then go towards the Salvation Army's Christmas Hampers. We were heartened by the response. Much gratitude.



The Year 9's Food Drive was equally responsive, with students designing and delivering the positive cause campaign to R-6 classes. Students were encouraged to donate a non-perishable food item towards Anglicare's Wallaroo Emergency Pantry. About 20 boxes of non-perishable food was collected during Week 4. Items included pasta, cereal, biscuits, spaghetti and baked beans as well as baby food. The project was a cross-curriculum initiative utilising knowledge from Geography and English lessons, as well as creative digital media skills.

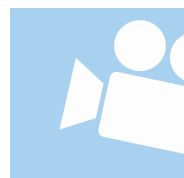
