# From the Principal's Desk

As the 2017 school year concludes I reflect on some of our 'Learning for our Future' achievements.

Today's students are empowered to be 'critical thinkers', encouraged to collaborate with their peers, problem-solve, and communicate their findings through conventional and digital forums. 'Critical thinking' often leads to creativity, brainstorming and new ideas which are applied across the curriculum. Students have numerous learning opportunities to build these skills.

We are a progressive school with new innovative learning spaces to be built in 2018 as part of the Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) works. This exciting project is aimed at better preparing students for a workforce where jobs are yet to be invented.

It was with great excitement we celebrated our recent assemblies and showcase in the new Copper Coast Sport and Leisure Centre stadium. We enjoyed the new stage, extra space and state of the art sound system. This redevelopment is a prime example of what can be achieved when the community, schools and local councils work together.

The community has been a great support to student learning, from donating animals to our agricultural program, R-12 mentoring, canteen and classroom volunteers, work experience placements and involving our

students in events such as the Kernewek Lowender and World Challenge. These experiences offer 'real life' learning and role model leadership: providing a sense of belonging to a community.

I thank staff, students, parents, Governing Council and Parent Club for their support and guidance over the school year. I am proud of the big and small learning milestones and students' resilience when faced with setbacks. Student learning is a partnership between school and home with Family Information Nights, Parent Teacher Interviews, phone calls, communications and student postcards integral to building positive relationships. The recent presentation assemblies included sponsorship from past student groups in the graduating classes of 1992 and 1969 who have chosen to sponsor awards as a way of giving back to the school. This is an example of the special long-term connection past students have with the school.

Learning is life-long with our staff actively participating in Network Learning Groups and professional development opportunities. R-6 Arts educator Mrs Jo Hurrell achieved Lead Teacher National Certification and Trade School Support Officer Miss Hannah Dayman won a State Education Award in October.

**SCHOOL CARD 2018**: The School Card scheme offers financial assistance with educational expenses for students attending government schools in South Australia. A family's financial circumstances may change from year to year and so families must fill in an application form for School Card assessment <u>each year</u>.

PLEASE NOTE: The Gross Annual Income Limit has changed significantly for 2018 – more families may find they are able to apply for assistance.

## **HOW TO APPLY IN 2018**

#### Application form - Paper Copy

- Please come to school prior to the commencement of Term 1 (Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2018 or Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> January 2018) or early in the year to complete an application form for your family
- Forms will also be available at <a href="www.sa.gov.au">www.sa.gov.au</a> under the heading Education, Skills and Learning early in 2018 (print off, complete and return to school for processing).

## Application form - Online (ED003A – Income Audit applicants only)

• Online application forms using a touch screen device and wet digital signature will be available at <a href="www.sa.gov.au">www.sa.gov.au</a> under the heading Education, Skills and Learning early in 2018.

(Online applications will be emailed automatically to the government school/s where your child/ren attend (where two or more children attend different schools, all schools will receive a copy of the application form.)
