Through special events such as Family Information Night, staff and families begin making connections to build a strong partnership towards individual student's education. I look forward to seeing and meeting many of you on this night.

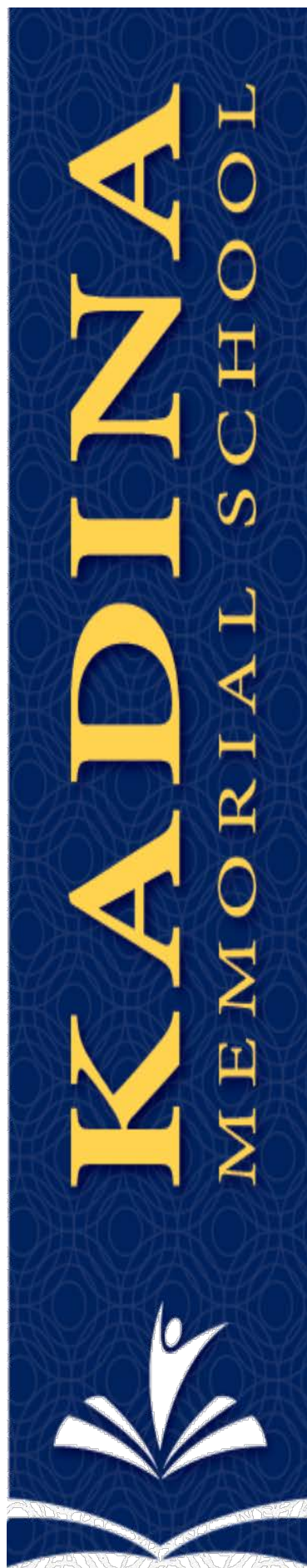

Hello and welcome to 2018!

Year 12 scores are the 'sprint' that we celebrate but you can only 'sprint' exceptionally with the very best training. It's the quality training and learning of 13 years of schooling that enables the best to be achieved. So the biggest congratulations goes to the students of 2017 but also a very big thank you to the families, support networks and staff for such a strong passion, patience and love. As we start the new year it's also a time for new beginnings, with renewed goals and aspirations for the future. I encourage you to keep the lines of communication open between your child and their teachers as students enter this new phase of specialised senior learning that will be enhanced by our new Daymap Parent Portal starting in Week 2.

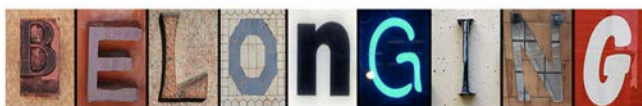
R-6 Corner

Welcome back to the 2018 school year. May I take this opportunity to especially welcome the Reception students and their families and newly enrolled students to Kadina Memorial. I hope you have all had a restful and rewarding holiday break and are ready for the challenges of this year. For those who don't know me, my name is Zelly Ritter and I am R-6 Head of School, Term 1. This is an incredibly busy term with Year 3-6 water safety commencing in Week 3, followed by KMSC elections and Inductions, Sports Day, Student Mentor and PAL training just to name a few. Our school focus for 2018 is **belonging and becoming**; The philosophy is, if children feel they **belong** to school this will help them to **become** better learners. Family night **Tuesday 13 February** is our first event for the year. 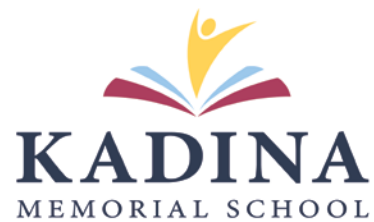

Arts offerings for 2018

At Kadina Memorial School all Reception to Year 6 students will attend one lesson a week of Performing Arts, which includes learning skills in Drama, Music and Dance.

In the Senior Years 7 - 12 Visual and Creative Arts, Drama and Music are offered. Staff involved in teaching senior years are Karen George, Jacq Barry, Sandy Hahn and Andre Starr. We welcome Ben Graefe as the Primary Arts Teacher for this year.

Recorder lessons are offered to Year 4 students by audition. This provides selected students with a 'taste' of what it's like to have the expectation of regular practise, reading music, working as a team and performing. Often students and parents have a better guide as to whether they would like to take up weekly instrumental lessons in Year 5. They will meet Mr Graefe on Thursday, Week 4.

The Primary Choir has the opportunity to perform at the Festival of Music later in the year is offered to Year 5 and 6 students. In early Term 1 Mr Graefe will be auditioning ALL Year 5 and 6 students. Students who receive an invitation to join can then make a decision with their parents. Choir will be held weekly at times to be advised.

This year we have 80 students from Years 5 to 12, attending free Instrumental lessons once a week, with specialist IM teacher Dom Meehan.

All Instrumental students also attend an Ensemble lesson -:

- ♪ **Second years and up combine for a Concert Band rehearsing after school every fortnight starting from Monday 19 February (Week 4) at the Kadina Town Hall beginning at 3:15pm - 4:30pm.** Students will be dismissed from the Town Hall and clear pick up arrangements need to be communciated by the parent/caregiver.
- ♪ Invited Senior students will meet Mr Hahn after school as members of the well acclaimed KMS Jazz Band beginning Week 2 on a day to be agreed

All relevant students will be given more details via DAYMAP and Newsletters prior to their lessons commencing. If your child is new to Kadina Memorial School and you believe they would benefit from being in one of the above groups, please see or email Mr Sandy Hahn at sandy.hahn701@schools.sa.edu.au

World Challenge 2017

What an adventure we had! On Monday 20 November 2017, 14 students from Year 10 and 11, teachers Mr Williams and Miss Hicks and expedition leader (local lad and former Kadina Memorial High School student) Mat Millard, embarked on a trip of a life-time to Laos and Cambodia for Kadina Memorial School's first World Challenge trip.

We travelled from Adelaide to Luang-Prabang, Vientiane, Dong Det, Siem Riep and Phnom Penh. We undertook a trek in Laos, where we slept in hammocks and ate our weight in sticky rice. We also worked on a project site at a local school in Cambodia, where we built a brick wall (including mixing cement by hand) and taught English lessons and games. In Cambodia we met with another former local and media identity 'Cosi' and visited a family who has benefited from his 'Cows for Cambodia' charity. That same night we hosted a dinner and activity night (the jumping castle was the highlight!)

We tried so many new foods, saw incredible sights, made new friends, and so much more. We made it home safely on December 20th, with a newfound appreciation for how fortunate we are to live here in Australia.

Daymap Parent Portal

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Daymap Parent Portal

Kadina Memorial School has been using Daymap for a number of years. Initially, just used for attendance we have increased its capacity to creating and writing reports and as a teaching learning tool for assessment tasks.

In 2018 we are going “live” to parents through our Parent Daymap portal.

This portal will enable you as parents to stay informed about school matters and individual student progress. It is securely accessible from your internet browser requiring only one login and password per parent to students enrolled at Kadina Memorial School. From your Parent Portal page, you’ll be able to view attendance details, see homework requirements and access school messages and notices.

Our teachers from Year 7 – 12 are using Daymap for assessment information and results. You will be able to track these and discuss with your child how they are going in real time.

This information will be available 24/7 and is secured by a unique account and password. You can only access your own child/children’s information.

We will be creating the accounts based on the email you have registered at the school.

So how do I access it?

From Tuesday 6 February Week 2 - 3:30pm onwards you will be able to:

- 1) Visit the KMS website – www.kms.sa.edu.au
- 2) Hover over ‘Contact Us’ and select ‘Daymap – Parent Portal’
- 3) Register as a ‘New User’
- 4) Enter your email address (this is the one you have provided us)
- 5) Enter the ID Number of one of your children.
- 6) It will then send you an email with your username and password to login.

Students’ ID Numbers can be found on their timetable and on their Student ID card. R-6 students will be given their student identification number next week, please check their diaries and communication books.

- ❖ **By Phone:** Contact KMS Finance Office on 8821 0111 to pay via phone.
- ❖ **Internet Payment:** Pay directly into KMS bank account, Kadina Memorial School, Bank SA, BSB number 105-004, Account number 051004640 with Family Code and child's name in reference details.
- ❖ **Centrepay Instalments:** You can arrange for regular deductions from your Centrelink payments. Contact the Finance Manager at KMS for application forms and further information.
- ❖ **Direct Debit by Instalment - Bank Account or Credit Card:** Call the Finance Office on 8821 0111 to arrange for a Direct Debit agreement.
- ❖ **School Card:** School Card assistance must be applied for each year. School Card income limits for 2018 using Form A are based on your combined family gross income for the 2016-2017 financial year. There is an opportunity to apply for School Card using other criteria such as Change of Circumstances, Self-Employment and Hardship.

Friendly Streets and Safer Roads

You may have noticed a few road changes on Doswell Terrace thanks to a \$68,700 State Government grant to create safer roads in the school precinct area.

Kerb protuberances, pavement bars, traffic signage and extensions of shared paths are being installed in various locations surrounding Kadina Memorial, Kadina Preschool, Harvest Christian College and Wallaroo Mines Primary School.

The white cement protuberances on Doswell Terrace, pictured below, provide students and families a safe place to stand while safely waiting to cross the road. Previously they have weaved their way through parked vehicles and on-coming traffic.

This project is supported by the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure's Residents Win funding and in partnership with your local Copper Coast Council.
