COVID-19 & Events heads-up

COVID-19 continues to impact our lives even though the risk is currently perceived as low. SA public schools adhere to strict measures to ensure sites remain safe from infection, including social distancing and minimising crowd numbers, including visitors on site.

The Department for Education (DfE) advises schools on COVID matters considering individual site's crowd capacity, which for our school is 1,000 people. This assists with contact tracing in the event of an infection, as well as minimising the number of people on school grounds.

This means annual events, such as Induction Assemblies and Sports Days, will be managed very differently in 2021.

The KMSC/ House Induction and Year 12 High Achiever Assembly will be held in the Copper Coast Sport and Leisure Centre on Friday 19 February with only one invited guest per KMSC/ House representative and prize recipient. Guests will register via the Eventbrite link provided in their invitation. I have also been informed that parents and caregivers will NOT be able to attend our two-day sports days as it will breach the site's maximum crowd capacity. We have investigated various alternatives continue to be restricted by numbers. This is a dilemma every large school is wrestling with until a vaccine becomes available. New building works update

Students and families will notice lots of fencing and bunting in place near the secondary oval and performing arts precinct, which will inconvenience movement across the school until term 4.

Middle and senior students can access the oval and basketball court via a pathway near the boys' changerooms as well as from the primary oval. The fencing is in place to keep the school community safe as building works on the Special Options and Performing Arts Centre begin.

Bus students will also follow a slightly different path when arriving and departing school. Students will be 'talked' and 'walked' through this alternative route during Care Group.

The arrival of the Special Options classrooms is slightly behind schedule, and we anticipate this will be ready by week 4. Both Ms Hawes' 21SH and Mrs Henderson's 21TH classes will move into these specifically designed learning spaces by mid-term.

Following a successful trial in 2020 all R-6 classes will play then eat at recess in term 1. Significant social and learning benefits were evident last year including students being able to play with their friends all recess (and not needing to find them mid break in the yard), less grumbly tummies from midday on, meaning this learning time was maximised and less litter in the yard. There is also potential for 'nude food' options at recess as containers can easily be returned to bags. Healthy fruit/vegie snacks are encouraged during the early lessons of the day to assist with lots of learning.

Twelve Kadina Memorial School Year 12 students have achieved an Australian Tertiary Admissions Ranking (ATAR) of over 90 (Raw Score), a record number of high achievers for the school in one year.


