R-6 Corner Sports Day Health Hussle

2021 sees a new start to the R-6 Sports Day with a health hussle rather than a parade.

Music and choreography have been chosen by Primary House Captains, guided by Performing Arts teacher Mr Ben Graefe.

The health hussle provides an opportunity for all students to be involved and house captains leadership experience to make decisions and lead their teams.

Captains have recorded and shared their House Hussle via Class Dojo encouraging students to practice their routine at home.

The result? A fun dance routine, requiring coordination and most importantly teamwork to move at the same time to the music beat.

On Sports Day students will be judged on how energetically teams dance, know the choreography, and move with the music.

Sports Day Tabloid Approach

The Junior Primary and Primary sports days look, sound and feel quite different and we are sometimes asked 'why?'.

The Primary Sports day is a tabloid approach in the morning with points for skill level and competitive events in the afternoon. The Junior Primary is also a tabloid approach in the morning with points for participation.

Experts in both youth sports and child development agree: children are not ready for competition until they are at least 8 years old (around year 3). Before that, they just can't handle the stresses of winning, losing, and being measured and scored on their performance. In the early years sports should be about physical activity, having fun, learning new skills and laying the groundwork for good sportsmanship.

In Junior Primary students' weekly PE lessons and when playing games in class, these key messages are applied and reinforced. Children involved in competition too young can find this an unpleasant experience which impacts on their future participation.

That doesn't mean all children are ready for competitive teams once they turn eight years old. For many, it's not until about age 10 they grasp some of the nuances inherent in competition eg It's hard to learn that sometimes, you lose even when you try your best.

Developmentally, children playing competitively need to have sufficient self-discipline and a good attention span. They need to be mature enough to listen to and respect the coach/teacher and be able to work effectively with a large group. If a child is super-passionate about soccer but doesn't have the patience to perform practice drills over and over, they may not be ready for a competitive team.

By organising the R-6 sports day in this way we are providing the best learning experiences for our early years students and building a strong foundation for future active participation.

As adults we thrive on positive feedback as an acknowledgement that we have completed good work, made choices that have seen positive results and have implemented strategies showing improvement in outcomes.

Our students are no different. They too like receiving positive feedback and acknowledgement that they have achieved desired outcomes. Often many skills take time to develop, and this persistence and ability to continually improve, requires lots of positive recognition for them to keep persevering.

Our focus in the Unit is on Positive Behaviour interventions to encourage and model desired behaviours. Staff consistently reinforce positive behaviour and outcomes with lots of praise for a job well done.

The Junior class has been focussing on social skills and what makes a good friend through 'bucket filling'. They have had their individual buckets filled with lots of stickers and stamps when good choices have been made, and the class bucket filled with happy face ping pong balls as a celebration of positive outcomes.

The Senior class students receive 'coins' for when they are displaying our school values which are then exchanged for items on a chart as a reward for good choice making.

It's great to see the smile on our students' faces when they are positively engaged with their peers and staff and enjoy coming to school.



Stage 2 Outdoor Education – Kayak Practice at CCSLC

In preparation for the upcoming Kayak trip to Katarapko Creek, the Stage 2 Outdoor Education class conducted a risk assessment of the pool area to determine whether it was suitable to practise some capsize drills.

Satisfied with the risk rating of our activities we used a map and compass to navigate through the construction works carrying two kayaks, personal floatation devices, paddles, and other safety equipment. Gen was our extra set of eyes should anything unforeseen occur.

Waiting nervously by the water's edge, one by one, the students were gently pushed to a suitable depth whereby they would not hit their head once upside down and submerged in their kayaks.

After a few deep breaths and last-minute requests for clarification, each student was required to fully turn over, remain upside down, bang three times loudly on the sides of their kayaks and then exit using the taught technique.

This was then repeated with the student wearing a spray deck. This is used to keep excess water from entering the kayak. After being taught how to release this, students were again required to capsize, remaining under water for a little longer before releasing their spray deck and then entering the kayak.

From here, students move their training sessions to Wallaroo where they will practice deep water rescues and build on skills learnt from the Stage 1 course.
