You will receive with this newsletter a letter detailing your child's progress at the end of term 3 using colour bands or a 'traffic light' approach. Progress is colour banded with purple = your child is working well and above standard, green = your child is performing at standard level, yellow means the child is at risk of not meeting the requirements of the learning area and a red colour indicates your child is not meeting the learning requirements and is well below standard.

Student's effort, attitude and attendance often impacts on their learning success at school. Students who attend and are focussed, listen, ask questions, take risks and respond to feedback make the most of their learning.

We used this 'at a glance' approach earlier in the year and many families took the opportunity to talk with their child regarding their progress with some contacting the teacher to plan for more information about how we can work together to maximise all learning opportunities.

We thank you for the time spent with your child discussing their learning.
