This year there is also a purple poppy panel to commemorate animals involved in conflict to honour these loyal and dedicated animal warriors. War animals are defined as any animal breed used by the Australian Defence forces in past and present conflicts and operational roles including military working dogs, horses, pigeons and camels.



P&F members also took the opportunity to tour the Community Garden in the Ag Block. They were amazed by the amount of work undertaken by students, staff, individuals, and groups.

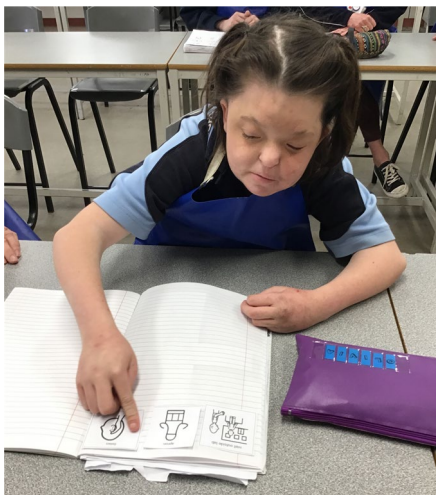
Unit News

Transitioning from home to school, from one activity to another or from one environment to another can cause anxiety for some of our students. Unit staff are highly skilled in recognising triggers and supporting students with strategies, ensuring these transitions are positive experiences for the students.

Visual schedules, individual timetables, consistent routines, countdown timers, access to calming/sensory spaces, scheduled breaks, Interoception and relaxation techniques and 1:1 SSO support assist students with complex needs to manage these transition times. Ultimately, our goal for students is to recognise their emotions and to ask for breaks or access to calming spaces using visuals/verbals when required.

Transitioning from the Junior class to the Senior class at the end of the year, is also another important milestone in the education of our students. Our program offers the transitioning student the opportunity to spend at least a day a week in the Senior class, with an accompanying SSO to support them with routines in that class, as well as other lessons throughout the week, including lessons in the Science laboratory. This term, Olivia Mahar is involved in this program, preparing her transition from the Junior class to the Senior class full time next year, and is very excited each Wednesday as she comes into the classroom with the big kids.

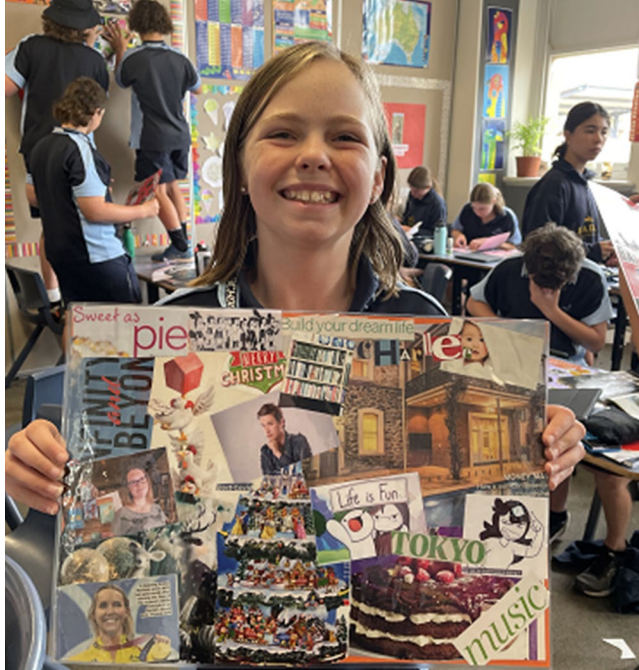

7KC made Vision Boards in Pastoral Care last week. Our vision boards included things we were striving for, things that inspired us or things that brought us joy.

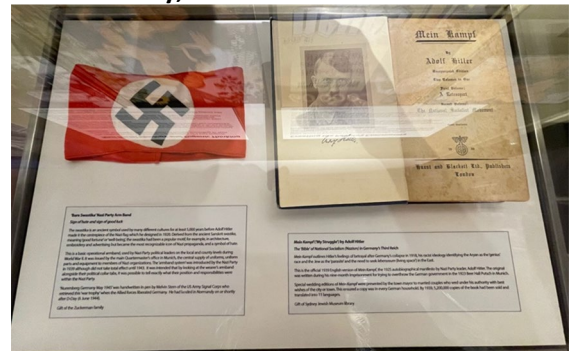


Year 10 History Trip

In week 3 of this term, Miss Bailey's and Mr Clayton's year 10 History classes visited a few of Adelaide's museums. The excursion formed part of an assessment; writing a review on how museums assist their learning. The first museum was the Steiner Education Centre where students met a Holocaust survivor, providing a first-hand perspective of the atrocities experienced by thousands of people at the time. This museum furthered their knowledge on the Holocaust, why it happened and the outcomes. World War 2 (WW2) artefacts, such as Adolf Hitler's *Mein Kampf*, a prisoners' concentration camp uniform and Sturmabteilung (Nazi Officer) armband, gave further meaning to the realities of WW2. The South Australian Museum displayed artefacts and detailed information about the history of Australia's First Nations People which provided students with a greater understanding of Australia's Indigenous heritage.

I know the students have gained valuable knowledge on both topics studied as part of year 10 History.

Community Garden Official Opening

Rain did not dampen the community spirit when officially opening the Community Garden on Wednesday 27th October. In Nharangga language the garden is called Ngarga Mayi Yarda, which means community/ mob – fruit and veg – land. It features a bush tucker area with a yarning circle, sensory garden, fruit and vegetable plots, as well as peace park area. Students have played a major role in the construction of the garden, with individuals and community groups pitching in at working bees, as well as donations.

The garden is the result of a three-way partnership between Kadina Memorial School, SOS Copper Coast Suicide Prevention Network and the Copper Coast Council after successfully being awarded a \$50,000 SA Healthy Towns Challenge grant.

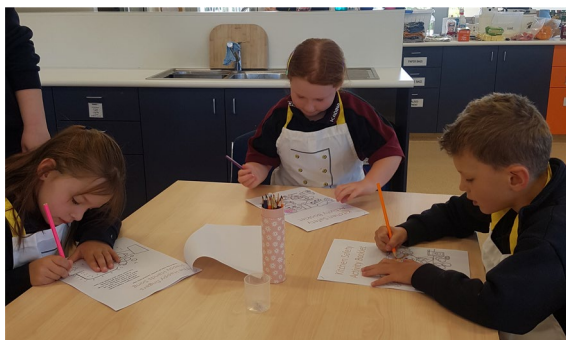


Too many cooks in the kitchen!

2022 School Sport age eligibility

As year 7's move into secondary education from next year, School Sport SA has made the following changes regarding age group eligibility.

SAPSASA state carnivals and championships

State carnivals

- Will be open to year 5 and 6 students only.
- Year 4 and year 7 students are not eligible for selection in district teams.
- If districts are unable to fill a team, they may request additional players from a 'paired district'.

Secondary year 7 to 12

- Year 7 students will be included in the secondary competitions.
- Competitions in most sports will be offered as
 - year 7 and 8
 - year 9 and 10
 - year 11 and 12
- Some smaller sports will be offered as
 - year 7 to 9
 - year 10 to 12
- Lower level secondary students can be selected in year 9 and 10, and year 11 and 12 teams if insufficient numbers

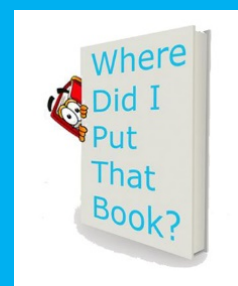
A reminder, as we are getting closer to the end of the term, please have a good search for any lost/borrowed books and return them to the Library.
