Enrol free maths tutoring – year 7, 8, and 9

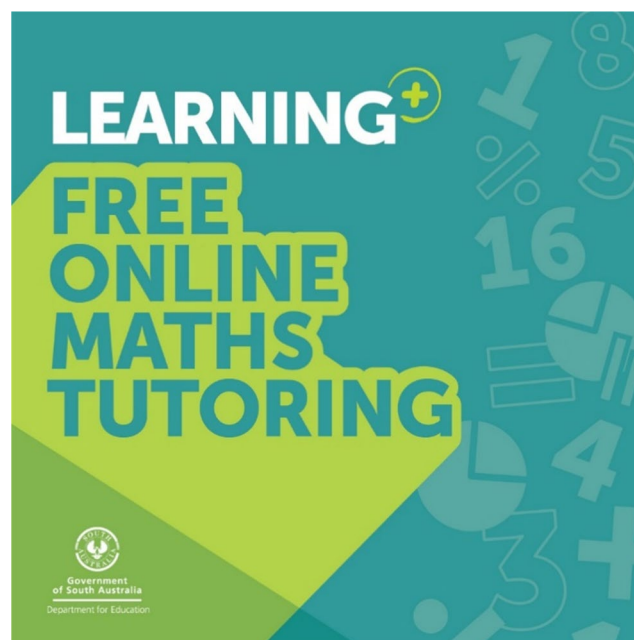
Year 7, 8 and 9 students are invited to level up their maths skills with the help of a free online tutor.

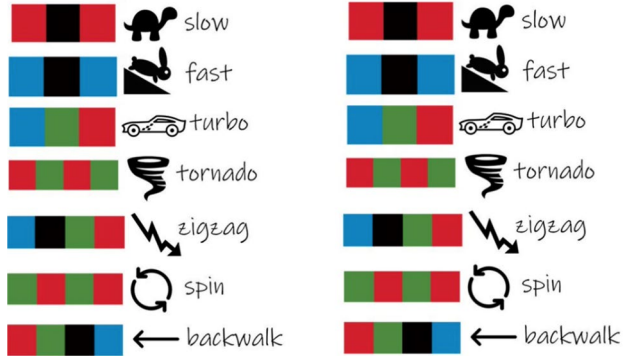
Ozobot coding

- A coffee van will be available on this day – please social distance whilst waiting for your order.

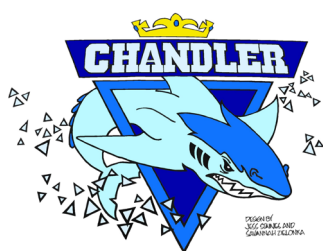
If the day/s are postponed, all pre-orders will be rescheduled for the Reserve Sports Day dates, Thursday 17th March, and Friday 18th March.
