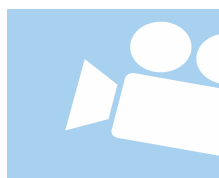

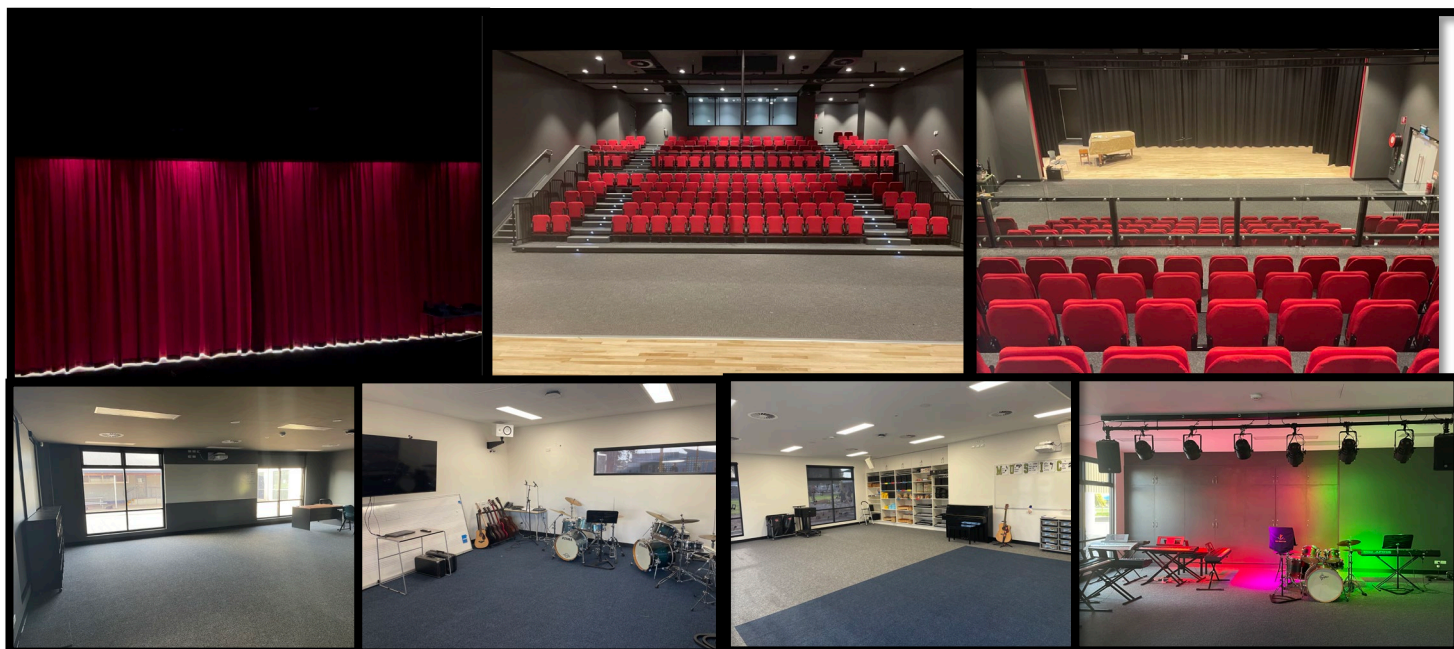

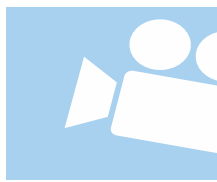
These groups are always in high demand and create a valuable link with our community. We thank all Arts students for the way they energise the culture and spirit of Kadina Memorial School.

Puyu Blasters

Puyu Blasters is a Tackling Indigenous Smoking Program by the Aboriginal Health Council to educate and encourage Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to lead their community to be smoke free. Tim, Trev and Snowy were our presenters for two sessions on the second day of term, where year 8-10 students learnt about the harmful effects of vaping. We learned that vapes (or e-cigarettes) contain many chemicals that don't belong in our lungs, and this often includes nicotine (even if they are promoted as nicotine-free).

Students enjoyed a game of golden child even though their shooting was affected for a while by goggles that simulated reduced vision that can be caused by smoking. Runners also wore masks to simulate greater difficulty breathing.

We thank our presenters, especially Tim Lawrence, for providing this opportunity for our students. Thanks also go to Leanne Toogood and Nigel Raymond (KMS Aboriginal Community Education Officers) for supporting the sessions.
