It is with relief that as a school we are tentatively returning to pre-COVID-19 times. The last few weeks have offered dynamic learning opportunities such as the Secondary School LifeChanger Program and Year 10 Bushwalk camps in the beautiful Flinders Ranges National Park.

2022 NAPLAN

Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 students have completed the 2022 National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy.

For a school of our size, it is a big logistical effort with about 340 students completing more than 50 NAPLAN sessions covering Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy over the past two weeks.

Students who were absent sat catch-up sessions and I thank families for their support.

The sessions ran smoothly noting students have become very adept to accessing online learning material.

A number of changes implemented by our IT Team and led by Head of Middle School Tarryn Germein also made the 2022 delivery of NAPLAN seamless.

I also thank the administration staff, overseen by Data Manager Heather Marks, resulting in our school successfully completing the annual program.

COVID-19 Update – masks in schools

A spike in positive COVID-19 student cases reported to school on Monday is a trend of the past four weeks.

This demonstrates COVID-19 continues to be experienced by students, families, and staff.

From the start of week 5, face masks in education settings will be:

- Strongly recommended (but not required) for all adults (including visitors) while indoors, except when it impedes ability to teach
- Strongly recommended (but not required) for students in years 3 to 12 while indoors.

Anyone who is a close contact and is aged 12 years and older will need to wear a mask when they leave the house for 7 days following exposure as per the [SA Health close contact guidelines](#).

Face mask use in COVID-19 outbreaks

Face masks will be required to be worn temporarily in education settings when COVID-19 transmission reaches certain outbreak thresholds, based on SA Health advice.

When certain outbreak thresholds are reached, face masks will be required to be worn by students in years 7-12 only, and all staff and adult visitors in the school for a 14-day period.

R-6 Corner: Zones of Regulation

The Zones is a self regulation tool to support students to understand their and other's feelings. Early Years students are using the characters from Inside Out and have watched the movie in the theatre over two weeks. Primary students have had pictures of faces to match with the zones and have watched clips from Dreamworks, Disney films and read picture books to support understanding.

Each class has designed a creative way to display the Zones of Regulation as a referral point which assist students to describe emotions felt at any given time.

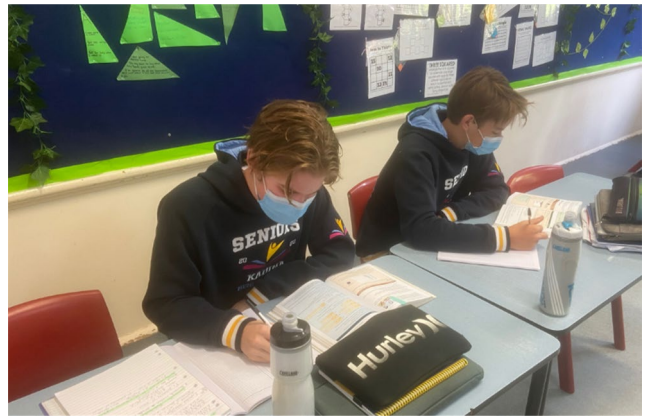

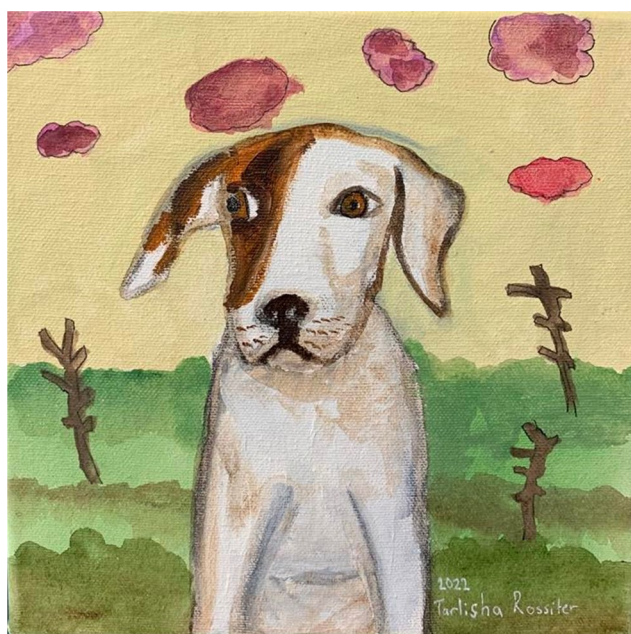
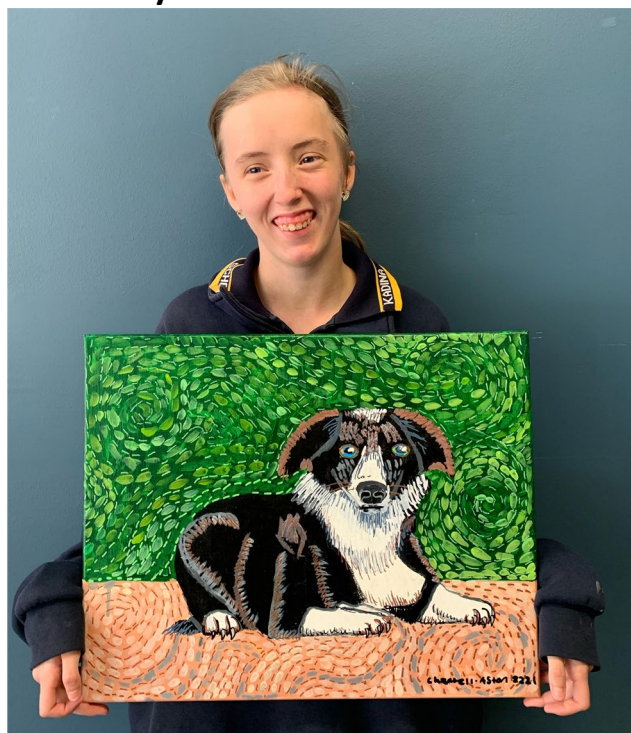
