The 2022 ADF Long Tan Youth Leadership & Teamwork Awards

The ADF Long Tan Youth Leadership and Teamwork Awards started in 2006 to recognise students who demonstrate leadership and teamwork within both the school and the broader local community. At the same time, the awards recognise those who display strong values, such as doing one's best, respect for others and "mateship", characteristics that are integral to Australian society.

The awards are an important initiative by the Australian Government in conjunction with the Australian Defence Force designed to encourage senior students – tomorrow's leaders – to actively participate in the life of their schools and local communities. Two awards are offered each year (Year 10 and Year 12). Following a nomination process, the winning students are selected by Kadina Memorial School leadership group based on the criteria set out by the ADF Long Tan Awards. This leadership group is headed by Year 10 and 12 Year Level Managers and advised by the Senior School Wellbeing Leader, Caregroup teachers and the Senior School Assistant Principal. Recipients of a Long Tan Youth Leadership & Teamwork Award will receive a certificate and a financial reward - \$250 for a Year 10 student and \$550 awarded to a Year 12 student.

The 2022 ADF Future Innovators Awards

The ADF Future Innovators Awards started in 2020 to recognise recipients' science and mathematics abilities while highlighting the value the Navy, Army and Air Force place on STEM skills and STEM career opportunities within Defence.

The awards are an important initiative by the Australian Government in conjunction with the Australian Defence Force designed to encourage senior students to actively participate in innovation and STEM fields. Two awards are offered each year (Year 10 and Year 12). Following a nomination process, the winning students are selected by Kadina Memorial School leadership group based on the criteria set out by the ADF Future Innovators Awards. This leadership group is headed by Year 10 and 12 Year Level Managers and advised by the Senior School Wellbeing Leader, Caregroup teachers and the Senior School Assistant Principal. Recipients of a ADF Future Innovators Award will receive a certificate and a financial reward \$250 for a Year 10 student and \$550 awarded to a Year 12 student.

KMS has been a proud supporter of these awards since their inception and are calling for nominations from Year 10 and Year 12 students. Nomination forms have been emailed to students, and hardcopies are available from Mr Hadges / Miss Wells (Year 10), Miss Tucker (Year 12) or the front office. The final date for nomination submissions is 3pm, Friday 29th July, 2022. The recipients will receive their award in the Prize Giving Assembly in Term 4.

Information Technology 2023

Students in year 7 and 8 2023

- Students will not use personal ICT devices at school, therefore families / caregivers of students in Year 7 & 8
 2023 will not be required to purchase an iPad for educational purposes.
- Sets of iPads will be purchased by the school for the students to use as required and will remain at school.

STUDENTS IN YEAR 9 – 12 2023

Year 9-12 students are required to have an Apple Macbook, or Microsoft Windows Device (please read minimal requirements on the schools website).

Families are able to purchase a Microsoft Windows / Apple Device from a supplier of their choice, however, please ensure the device meets minimal hardware requirements set by the school.

Alternatively, you may wish to purchase a school "ready to go" device that meets the minimal hardware requirements from two resellers, CompNow and HP, through a portal on the school website.

When purchasing the devices through the portal there is an option to apply for finance. The finance companies are independent and are not related to the school. Families are encouraged to read conditions carefully before signing.

With world-wide shortages of IT equipment continuing to significantly impact delivery times, it is recommended to consider purchasing or ordering your child's device for the 2023 school year as soon as possible to ensure delivery for the start of the new school year 2023.

If you need any further support with IT or finance please contact the school.

Frequently asked questions?

Does your school support Android Devices?

No, our site does not support Android due to network restrictions.

Does your School Support Chromebooks instead of Laptops or MacBook's?

No, our site does not support Chromebooks due to issues with logging into secure networks, Software not supported.

How do I get access to the Daymap as a parent?

We have instructions available on our website at https://www.kms.sa.edu.au/daymap/

Do I need to buy software for my child's device?

No, we supply access to range software available while your student is studying at Kadina Memorial School.

Should I buy extended warranty or accidental damage protection for my child's device or devices?

This is a personal preference, however, would recommend Apple care+ for apple devices, as it extends the warranty and covers 2 accidental breakages. This also applies for windows devices; you can ask for prices for extended warranty and cover for accidental breakage.

Can I buy second-hand devices for my child?

Yes, if it meets the minimal requirements we have set, however be in mind that second-hand devices have no warranty.

The Natural World of Science

Discovering and exploring the natural world occurs from birth. You might remember your baby, toddler and preschoolers always wanting to grab, hold, feel, smell, listen to and taste something in their sights! As they grow and develop, children begin to recognise that some objects are not for eating as well as observing other natural occurrences, such as wind, rain, and hot days. Scientific knowledge rapidly progresses when children inquire about their natural world. As educators we encourage students to explore and extend their questioning, as today's learners are the future innovators to improve the environment for people, as well as the animal and plant world.

Below are two examples of learning science at Reception and year 11 Stage 1 Biology.

We are learning about weather. In Science we made windsocks. We learnt that the windsock could tell us which direction the wind is coming from and if it is still, a gentle breeze or it is windy. We found out it was very windy on the day we tested our windsocks outside!

Stage 1 Biology – Warburto Point Excursion

On Tuesday 7th June, the Stage 1 Biology class, along with Miss Evans and Ms Pointon, travelled to Warburto Point to study the biodiversity of the mangrove and dune communities. Conditions were typical of June; wet, muddy and with showers at times, but students showed determination to keep going with their population sampling. Students counted plants using quadrats and transect lines to see the distribution of species in particular zones within the communities.

They enjoyed navigating the muddy conditions of the mangroves, and some were challenged with keeping their balance. Another challenge was had in the dunes community, of walking through dense shrubbery whilst being precise with the species that they identified. Thanks to Mark for driving during tricky conditions and to Ms Pointon for your passion and enthusiasm on the day.

The arrival of Winter meant the start of the Knockout Football season for our Year 7/8 cohort. Sadly, the poor weather reflected the outcome for the Kadina Memorial team with one win and one loss for the day not enough to see them progress to the next round.

The first game saw Kadina play Maitland Lutheran School in a heavily one-sided affair. Kadina gained early ascendancy and were never headed in an outstanding team display with every player contributing throughout the match. Riley Miller and Will Trengove controlled the centre of the ground, whilst Harry Rennie and Lachlan Bodie dominated inside forward 50. 'Buddy' Bodie ended the match with seven goals whilst Frank Goryan also hit the scoreboard with two majors. Kadina eventually ran out comfortable winners by 92 points.

Having watched the YP Combined Schools team defeat Maitland Lutheran School in the second game of the day, the Kadina players knew that the final game was their opportunity to progress to the next round.

Kicking into a five-goal breeze, Kadina struggled to get the ball past the halfway point of the field for much of the first half. The staunch defence of Riley Miller, Will Trengove and Tex Neumann limited the damage, but a lack of forward forays saw a 28-point deficit at the halftime break. Kadina continued the forward forays but couldn't manage to capitalise with goals; the comeback becoming more unlikely with each passing second. With five minutes remaining, the game was still in the balance. However, a brilliant piece of individual play from YP resulted in a goal, the first score into the breeze, which finally sunk Kadina's proverbial ship. YP were eventually crowned winners by 10 points.
