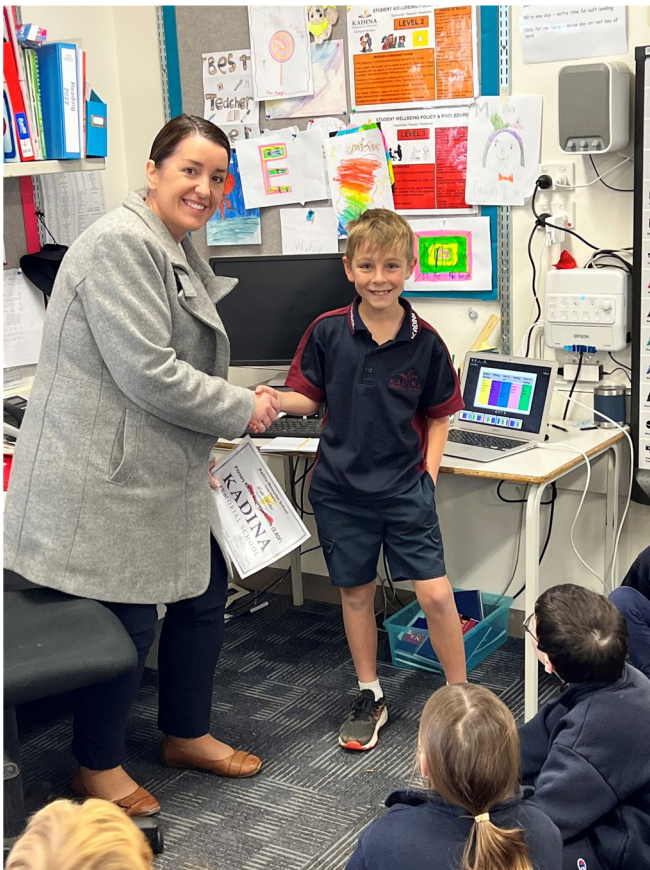

Year 8 Life Changer Program

This term our Year 8 cohort which consists of six classes across the year level, took the opportunity to participate in the Life Changer workshops led by Mitch Pert from Melbourne and supported by Phoebe Bazzacco from Adelaide.

Each session students took the time to reflect upon, and track their health, self-management, thoughts and feelings. Activities were aimed at **mental** and **physical health**. If we look after these areas, we can be mentally and physically tough when encountering difficult challenges and situations.

Priority was given to **skills** and goal setting. Being aware of opportunities and obstacles and creating a plan to always move forward. A major focus was gratitude, appreciating both small and big things that people do for us out of kindness or duty.

Understanding **self**, being kind with your self-talk. This topic students analysed how to reframe negative thoughts into positive ones and discussed how to create strategies which can make you feel better in the moment like box breathing, meditation, doing what you're passionate about and journal writing. This led to conversations about the hero and villain in all of us, with key insights into how to harness our hero as well as name and tame our villain!

The purpose of **purpose** was to reflect on our core strengths and create bucket lists, giving good reason as to why we dream to get the best from life.

The final session was connecting with **tribe**, knowing who is in your inner circle, those who love and know you the best. Taking the time to thank them, as well as appreciate all that we have in common, so we gain more insight and appreciation of each other.

Kadina Memorial School won a grant for this program to be trialed on Yorke Peninsula and we thank Amanda Schultz, Life Changer SA representative, for her ongoing support, as well as resilient and local guest speaker Cam Faulkner. We also thank Country SA PHN (Primary Health Network) for their sponsorship.

Stage 1 and 2 Outdoor Education Bushwalk

Wet and chilly conditions were predicted for the Outdoor Education bushwalk. A maximum of 10 degrees was forecast for Melrose on the Wednesday, with things heating up to a maximum of 11 the following day. The previous years we had been able to camp on private land with firewood provided in a sheltered environment away from the wind. Unfortunately, this location was not available so, given the conditions we decided to change our destination to Mambray Creek. The forecast here was much brighter with less rain and daytime temperatures forecast to be in the mid-teens.

The walk began with us disembarking at Baroota Mines. After some navigation exercises, we found ourselves walking along a creek line to Davey's Gully. Here, the track narrowed considerably as we contoured around a knoll before witnessing the vast expanse of Spencer Gulf. Descending back into camp the group enjoyed a roaring fire whilst engaging in some mind-bending games.

The next day was largely taken up with bushbashing. Walking on a bearing and leapfrogging through thick scrub proved entertaining and challenging. As the clouds covered the peaks of the national park we again followed an unexplored creek on our way to the second night of camping. Emerging from the scrub we were faced with negotiating a fence before setting up camp with one of the best views we had experienced. The glow of lights from Port Pirie, Whyalla and Port Augusta were our backdrop as we again warmed ourselves by the fire. Finer weather greeted us on the last day as we enjoyed the hour long stroll back to our pickup zone. Another enjoyable camp had by all as our students experienced "unbelievable views", "incredible scenery" and a "great fun bonding experience". 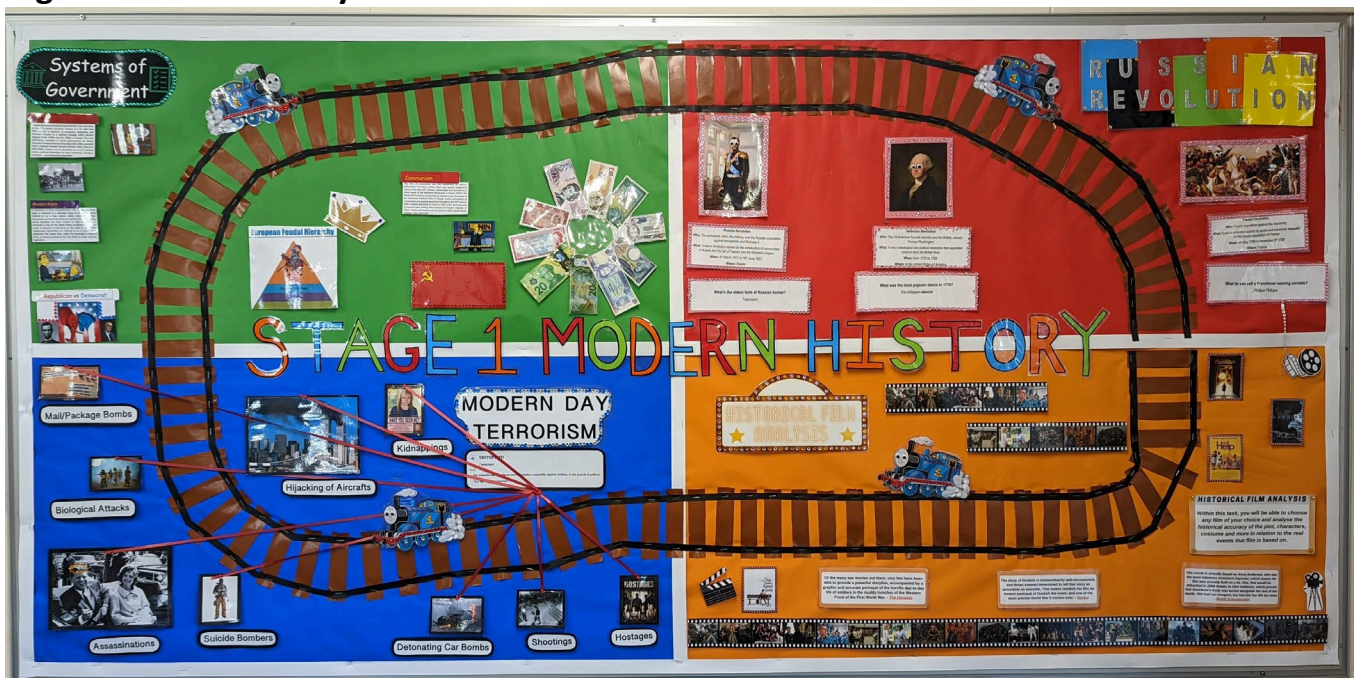
Year 10 History Excursion

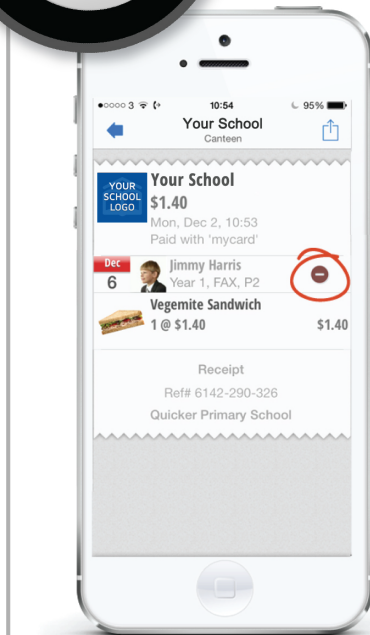

Cancelling lunch orders that have already been paid for

To cancel a food order from your itemized eReceipt:

- 1 Sign into your *Qkr!*™ account and scroll down to 'My Receipts' section
- 2 Select eReceipt for order you wish to cancel
- 3 You will see a red circle containing the 'minus' symbol beside your child's photo. Tap this. A pop-up box will appear asking if you wish to proceed. Tap 'Yes'

- 4 If your eReceipt contains food orders for more than one child, you will need to cancel one by one.

OR

To cancel a food order from the calendar view:

- 1 Sign into your *Qkr!* account and go to calendar view for food orders
- 2 Select date for which you wish to cancel order
- 3 Tap 'Cancel Items' on the pop-up box which appears
- 4 Another pop-up box will appear asking if you wish to proceed. Tap 'yes'

To reduce school costs, cancelled food orders are refunded in the form of credit for future orders. A 'Refunded' stamp will appear on your eReceipt confirming that the order has been cancelled and a credit is available for future food orders. The value of any outstanding food order credits will automatically be deducted from your next *Qkr!* food order.

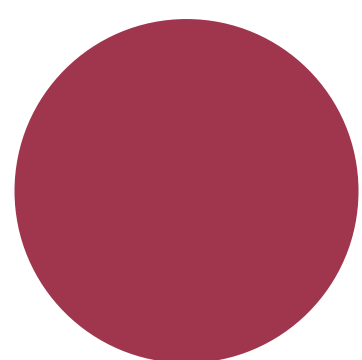
Please contact your school office directly to cancel any other (non-food) school payments. These refunds need to be processed through the school office according to school policy.

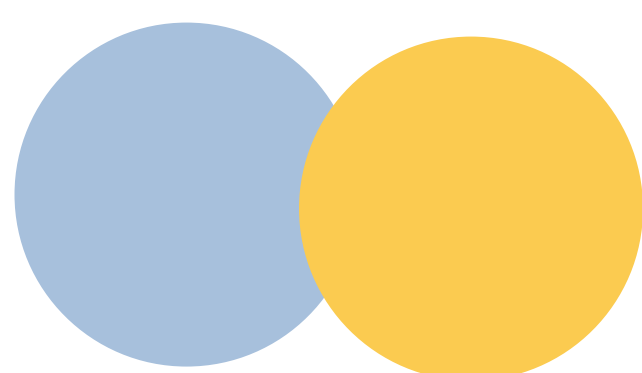

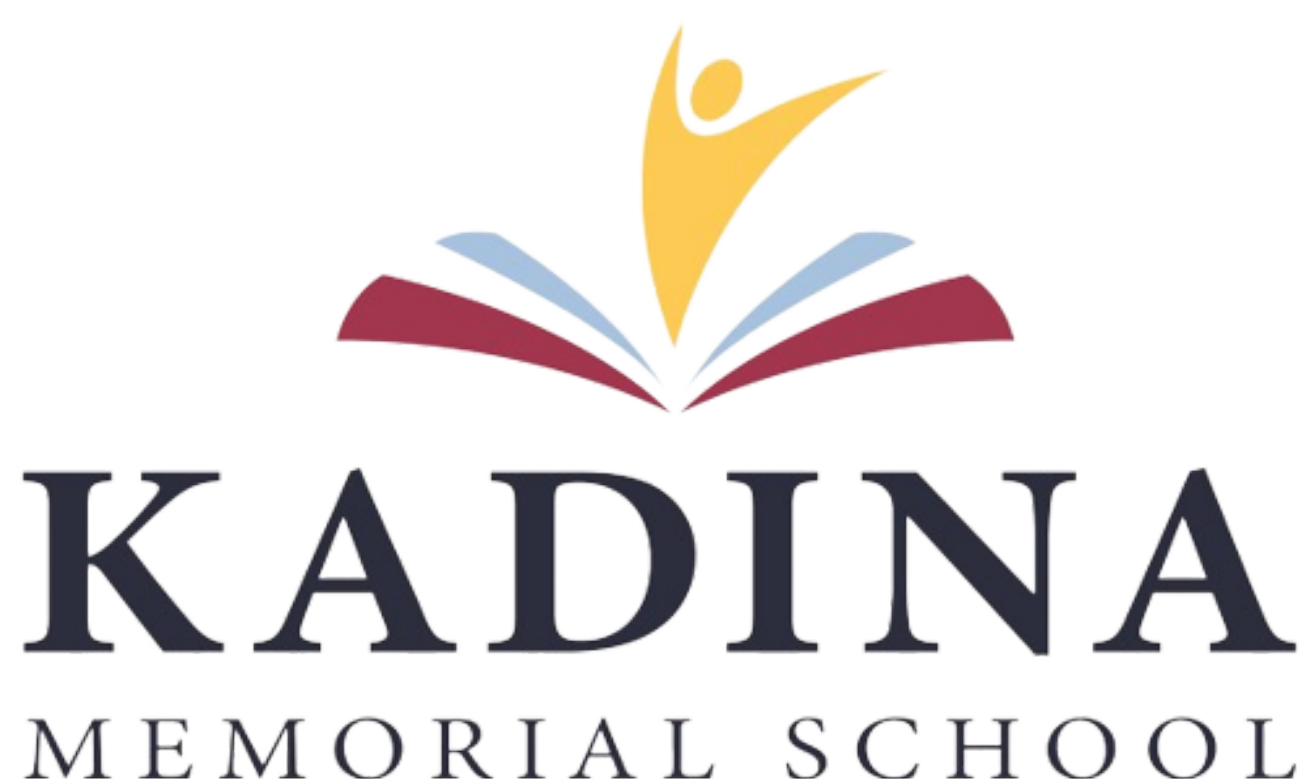
