



Simpson Prize

On 3rd July, I flew to Canberra for a 3-day trip with the other winners and runners-up of the Simpson Prize competition. We had packed days full of many unforgettable experiences, including the Last Post Ceremony at the Australian War Memorial, touring the Treloar Centre, and a ceremony at Parliament House with the Federal Education Minister. We attended the Last Post Ceremony on the second day of the trip, and I had the privilege of getting to lay a wreath on behalf of the Simpson Prize with Navisha, another participant of the prize. We toured the Treloar Centre on the same day. This centre is a storage facility of the Australian War Memorial and is home to many extraordinary artifacts that the general public don't typically see. Below are some pictures of things we were shown, with descriptions of what they are. On the final day of the trip, we attended Parliament house for the prize ceremony. We were presented with our certificates and medals and were provided with a lunch before heading to the airport to depart.

This experience was incredible, but the highlight was the like-minded people I met during the trip who will be life-long friends of mine.

Above, "G for George" was an Avro Lancaster B1 that carried out 90 operational missions during WWII over occupied Germany. Pictured right, at the back is bedding found in a Western Front trench. This still has mud on the wood from the trenches and has remained in almost the exact same condition as when it first was moved from the front after the First World War. At the front of this is the meshing that was used to support and hold up the trenches. This has also been kept in almost identical condition as to when it was removed from the trenches.


BOOK WEEK BOOK FAIR
