It caps off a busy year for the Arts Team with a Drama Showcase delivered by students on the same day and a Visual Arts Exhibition (pictured) in the theatre this week.

As a school, I know students and staff have thoroughly enjoyed and appreciated having the theatre and purpose-built classrooms to extend their studies.

Our local arts community has also benefited from the amazing facilities by hosting various dance and music concerts.

As a large school we are grateful to have a theatre with tiered seating to cater for seminars and larger meetings. It's a space we could only ever wish for before receiving the Building Better Schools grant.

Triumphs of Kapyong

Students in Kapyong learned how to find locations using grids and grid referencing with excel and word. They needed to airdrop and save work to One Drive and use colour on their grids.

Learning on Country Excursion

Nha marni. When asked about our Learning on Country excursion, students' responses were enthusiastically positive. Great fun was had with KMS students meeting or reacquainting themselves with younger Point Pearce children and enjoying spending time together. All the students joined in with playing "Edu", requiring planning and cooperation by the two teams. Many other games and activities were initiated by students to enjoy together.

Learning took place in the Point Pearce school history room and yard, as well as during a walk around the town. Students were intrigued by the church and original mission school building, especially how boys and girls were once segregated based on different expectations for them. They also learned why a garden and display boards have been created to recognise the Stolen Generation and its effects on the area. Students were engaged in learning about Narungga culture, including why this local group is known as the Gynburra (Butterfish) Mob, and some other totems of Aboriginal groups. Students explored maps of Country and historical photos, realising the importance of their ancestors, and discussed their own connections.

A delicious barbeque lunch was enjoyed by all before a group photo, a word of thanks by Noah and final farewells drew the visit to a close.

As well as a chance to learn on and about Country, the day provided an opportunity for First Nations students from our school to see who else is part of this group, spend time together learning and playing, and building their sense of identity.

We are very grateful to the staff and students of the Point Pearce campus of Central Yorke School for welcoming us into their space and sharing the day with us. Many thanks also go to our KMS staff members who supported the excursion: Nigel, Leanne, Mrs Bussenschutt, Ms Chamberlain and Mrs Morrison as well as Janette and the Front Office Team.

Congratulations to all the students who came along; it was a highly successful day, and we look forward to planning another trip in the future. Ngayi yunggu! "For the trip to Point Pearce we went to the school that was only Reception to year 2. We went to the museum there and learnt that the Nharangga mob is also called the 'Butterfish mob'. One of the teachers said that you could walk out to Wardang Island and on the way out they caught butterfish. We also learnt that Point Pearce was a mission camp. To leave the camp you had to get a letter that said "you can go". It was a good place to visit for learning on country." – Ollie Toogood


Only 200 copies will be printed this year and are available for purchase at \$25 (incl GST).


