#### SACE Art Show Awards

Kadina Memorial's 'Class of 2022' Year 12 students shone at the SACE Art Show in April.

Lily-Anne Marks brought the Fleurieu Peninsula to life with her semi-abstract artwork '*Victor Harbor*', winning the public vote for the SACE Art Show Community Award first prize.

Cheylen Wanganeen's artwork 'Totems that Wander the Land' featuring Yorke Peninsula's Nharangga totems was joint winner of the Minister for Human Services Regional Encouragement Award. In addition, Cheylen's piece was selected to be displayed in the Chief Executive and the Minister for Education head offices until next year.

The Community Teaching award was presented to Lily-Anne's teacher Ms Karen George, recognising a teacher's considerable mentoring role provided to emerging artists, sharing time and skills to produce quality artwork.

The awards were presented at the closing ceremony held at Light Square Gallery on April 14.

Over 4000 people visited the exhibition featuring 141 art and design works created by students studying SACE art in 2022.

Both Lily-Anne and Cheylen continue to paint and draw and are considering ways they can further their visual art skills. Emily Koch, currently in year 12, and Emma Prout, also had their Stage 2 pieces displayed.

#### Dear Parent/Guardian

#### Re: Wellbeing and Engagement Collection survey

Our students have been invited to take part in the Wellbeing and Engagement Collection survey. The survey will be open in weeks 2 to 5 of term 2 (Monday 8 May to Friday 2 June 2023).

#### Purpose of the survey

Young people's wellbeing is an important part of how they learn at school. The survey seeks students' views about their wellbeing and their engagement with school. Students in years 4 to 12 across the state will be invited to participate and the information collected will help the education system and broader community to support young people's health and wellbeing.

#### What is the survey about?

The survey asks students about their social and emotional wellbeing, school relationships, engagement and learning in school, physical health and wellbeing and after school activities.

#### How will students complete the survey?

Teachers will arrange for students to do the survey during class time. They will be asked if they would like to participate and are free to withdraw at any time. *If you do not want your child to participate, please contact the school as soon as possible after receiving this letter*.

#### Will students' information be kept confidential?

Students' personal information and identity will remain anonymous. Survey responses are confidential and no one (including school staff) can use the results to identify individual students. Participating schools with fewer than 5 students undertaking the survey will not receive a report of results, to protect the confidentiality of students.

#### What will happen if a student is distressed during or after the survey?

The survey includes some questions on topics such as student happiness and bullying.

Teachers will inform students that:

- if they find the survey uncomfortable or distressing, they should leave the survey immediately
- it is not compulsory to take part in the survey as a whole
- students can skip individual survey questions if they wish.

Students who would like to speak to an adult about any concerns they may have will be supported to do so.

## Stage 2 Outdoor Pursuits Kayak Trip – South Para Reservoir

In 2023, Year 11 students have been given the opportunity to study a new subject with "Outdoor Pursuits" replacing "Outdoor Education". This subject still enables students to attend camps, however a new curriculum means assessment tasks can be more flexible and tailored to student interests.

The recent flooding of the Murray River meant that campsites along the river were out of bounds for school groups. Therefore, some flexibility in planning was required.

South Para Reservoir lies in the Adelaide Hills, near the town of Williamstown and the Barossa Valley. With several of the state's reservoirs now open to the public for recreational use, South Para seemed to be a perfect location for a new adventure.

After a 2-hour drive we found ourselves on the reservoir bank, with kayaks loaded, safety checks complete and rain jackets packed. Riley Beech ran us through a fishing workshop whereby we were taught how to rig up a tracer, to catch some of the many fish that inhabit these waters. The hills provided a spectacular back drop as we meandered around the shoreline, discovering hidden bays suitable for a break to take in the tranquility. The most challenging part of the day was getting the group to move on as catching the biggest perch proved one of the main class goals.

Group work and decision making were focuses for the students as they navigated to a small island to set up for lunch and participate in more fishing. Winding our way back, the fish started biting as Rex Monger pulled in 3 perch within 20 minutes, comfortably winning the competition.

Camp for the night was on private property in a picturesque paddock backing onto the Warren Reservoir. With a fire set and some dinner cooked, the class engaged in some games of spotlight before retiring for the night.

This term sees students competing in a "Master Chef" camp cooking competition and working together to plan and participate in a multi-day bushwalk.

Seasons for Growth is an evidence-based change, loss and grief education program that uses the imagery of the seasons to illustrate the experience of change, loss and grief.

Children and young people can experience grief following significant changes and losses:

- Someone they love dies
- Separation and divorce
- Friendship changes
- + Illness impacts their life
- Relocation
- Natural disasters

Seasons for Growth aims to strengthen the social and emotional wellbeing of children and young people by:

- Exploring the impact of change and loss on every-day life
- Learning new ways to respond to these changes.

## **Program Structure**

The Seasons for Growth Children and Young People's Program is a small group program which runs for 45 minutes over eight weeks. The program offers four levels with tailored, developmentally appropriate activities and discussions.

Level 1:	6-8 years
Level 2:	9-10 years
Level 3:	11-12 years
Level 4:	13-18 years

Each session explores a theme using the seasonal imagery:

- Life is like the Seasons
- Change is Part of Life
- Valuing My Story
- Caring for my Feelings
- Making Good Choices

The program provides a safe space for children and young people where they can give voice to their experiences, understand their feelings, learn problem-solving and decision making skills, develop friendships, and recognise they are not alone.

A *Seasons for Growth* journal is provided to each participant to document their learning journey.
