The boys will now play Seaton High School for a place in the state final held in Term 3.

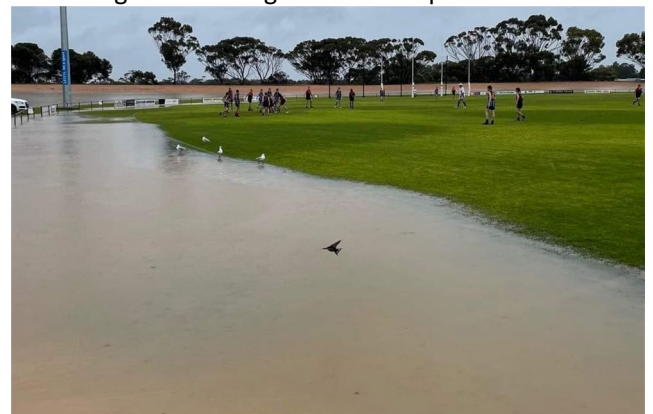

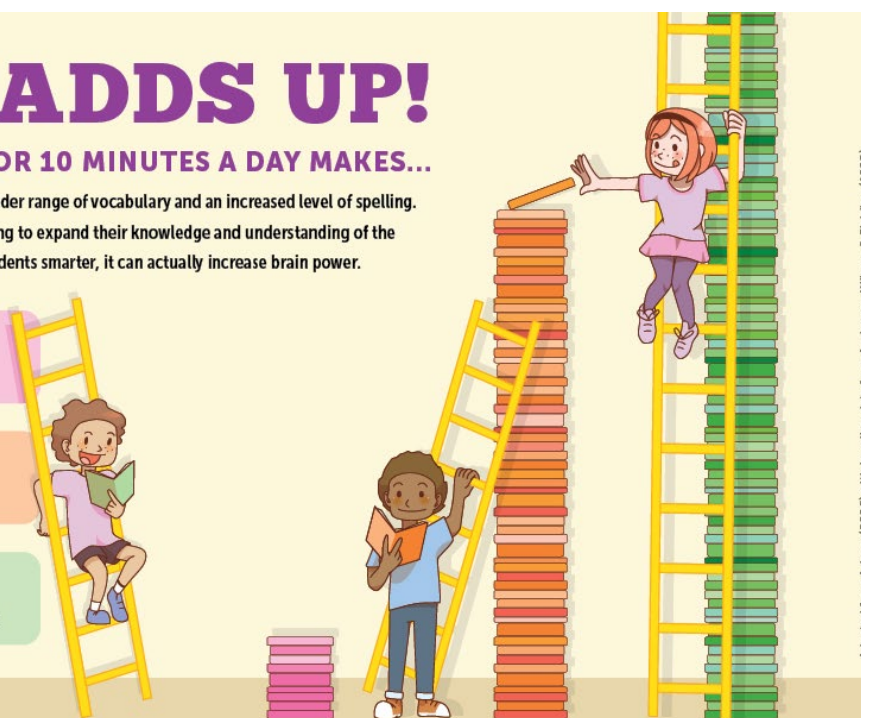
