### Stage 2 Outdoor Pursuits – Bushwalk

A 3-day bushwalk to Mount Brown in the Southern Flinders Ranges was a culmination of 6 weeks' work, where students were largely in control of the entire camp. The task of organising the trip was divided into several different roles including: "Transport and Costing", "Location", "Safety", and "Equipment and Entertainment". Students brainstormed their roles and what they needed to research. Weekly meetings were held to share and record information. Rex and Riley B were in charge of organising the location and chose Mount Brown Bush Camp as our starting point. Charlie and Damian were our safety officers, identifying hazards with transport, the campsite, cooking and the hikes, Nick and Riley L organised the bus and costed the trip, and Connor and Declan were in charge of equipment.

Mr Wood was in charge of the weather and did his job perfectly as there was not a cloud in the sky for the majority of the camp. He was even able to lift the morning fog as we climbed the mountain, revealing breathtaking views north toward Quorn, west towards Port Augusta and east across the Willochra Plain.

The multi-day bushwalk enabled students to piece together skills they have learnt in their previous assignments including, meal planning and first aid.
