A whole-school assembly celebrated student achievements, learning, and extra-curricular activities at the Copper Coast Sport and Leisure Centre last Thursday.

This newsletter is a celebration of school spirit and the effort of all involved.

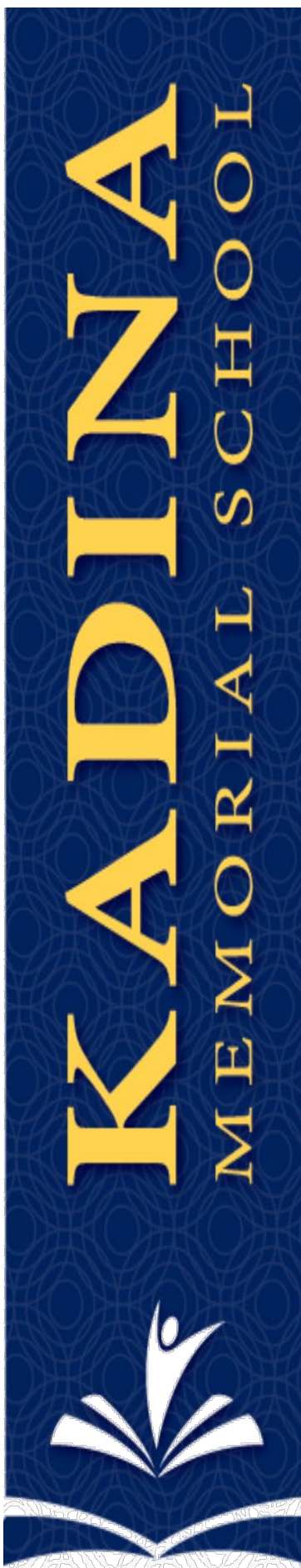

School Mental Health Practitioner

We are pleased to announce that the Department for Education is implementing a school-based mental health service for students at Kadina Memorial School. This service started last Monday 25th September 2023 and adds extra mental health supports to our school.

We welcome School Mental Health Practitioner Robyn Sherry to our team. Robyn will be employed in our school to provide support to students experiencing emerging and mild-moderate mental health concerns.



Students will have access to services including one-on-one assessment of mental health concerns, intervention support, help with triaging and referring students into external services and support returning to school after mental health treatments. The School Mental Health Practitioner will also help build the mental health literacy of our school community.

Royal Adelaide Show Report

Steers

On the Friday 1st September the SA Young Beef Breeders Handlers competition took place. Ava Papps won 5th place in the Novice Handler competition, Lucy Bussenschutt competed in the Intermediate class and won 3rd place. Jack Pridham was entered into the Experienced Handler Class even though still being eligible for the Novice class. He did a superb job, but unfortunately, he did not place in this class. No doubt we will see him result in 2024.

Sunday was the steer judging day with our three steers competing in the School's Led Steer Competition. Teddy (Red Poll) led by Claire Venning, and Texas (Murray Grey) led by Indy Keading, were placed in the same weight class as each other with Texas receiving 3rd place. Teddy, although receiving very good feedback from the judge, did not place in this class.

Silvana Humphries led Tank, the Angus cross Limousin and received a 4th place ribbon in what was an incredibly strong class of crossbred steers.

The Led Steer Competition is a Hoof and Hook assessment of the animals. Hoof meaning the animals are judged while walking around in a showring, hook meaning they are judged on their carcass attributes in the cold room.

Teddy (Red Poll) received 1st place in this competition while Texas (Murray Grey) received 3rd in the same class. Tank (crossbred) was placed 6th in his class for his carcass.

Merino Wethers

Vanessa Koch and I took 2 teams of 3 Merino Wethers, led by 6 different students including Anna Freeman, Cassidy Smith, Lachlan Mill, Christopher Grantham, Jimmy Secker and Silvana Humphries. We were not expecting to be making any placings in this competition due to the school not getting the sheep until well after the usual starting time. However, the sheep were still very competitive and did not look out of place amongst sheep from other schools that had already been shorn and started on feed months in advance. The students did a great job and represented the school highly professionally. Thank you to all families who assisted during the show week. Our cattle and sheep sites looked amazing!

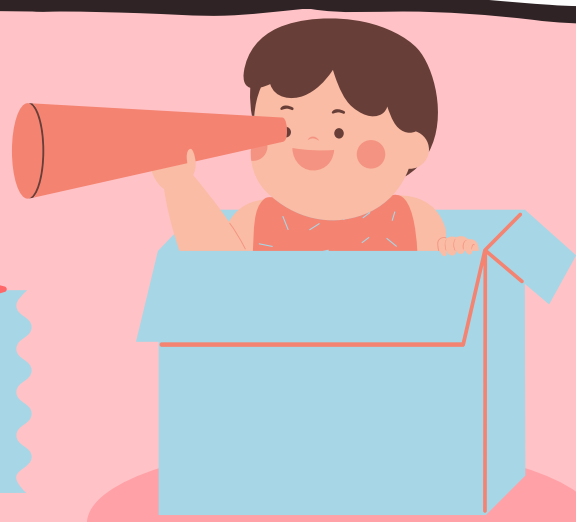


