Important Bushfire Information

Kadina Memorial School has a "low risk" bushfire rating.

At Kadina Memorial School on days of catastrophic fire danger, no school buses or taxis will run. The school will remain open. As the school may not receive notification of this until after the school has closed, it is vitally important families have up to date mobile phone, email contacts recorded at the school or like the "Kadina Memorial School" Facebook page.

If buses / taxis are cancelled during the school day, then parents will be notified via a text message and "Facebook" and students will be supervised at school until buses can run or students are collected by parents.

If school is open, but your child's bus or taxi service morning run has been cancelled, you will need to make your own travel arrangements. If your child is unable to attend because of the transport cancellation, you will need to advise the school.

It is important that all students know about their own family bushfire plan. If there is a fire, students are likely to know about it quickly and will become anxious if their family is likely to be affected. In times of danger, it is possible that incorrect information is transmitted. We will need to maintain a state of calm whilst the students are at school and the more they are aware of the plan, the easier it is to care for them.

During days of forecast catastrophic fire danger rating or an actual bushfire, information will be provided on the Departmental Parent Hotline (1800 000 279), ABC Radio 891 and local Regional stations, ABC TV.

"Milky Way" the Picasso Cow Project (named by Year 5/6, Tanya McCarthy's class)



Students studied the processes involved in the creation of dairy products in class. Using their learning they designed what they thought should be painted on our blank fibreglass cow, donated by Dairy Australia.

Class teacher Tanya McCarthy and Art teacher Karen George chose pictures from each of the students' designs which were reproduced on Milk Way. Students painted the design in stages throughout term 3 2023.

Follow the journey of milk from the farm to home as learnt by the students all the way around her.

Milky Way had her first public appearance at the 2023 Yorke Peninsula Field Days and is currently visiting the Ascot Theatre as part of a school art display. Her diary is becoming quite busy!

This competition is run every term each year by the Dairy Australia's Picasso Cow Program to promote dairy consumption and educate students on the dairy industry.







KMS Food Drive 2023

Dear Parents/Caregivers,

The KMS Yr 9 cohort and the Middle School KMSC have planned the 2023 KMS Food Drive, to be held during Week 4 (Monday 6th November – Friday 10th November) of this term. Students are utilising their knowledge and skills developed in Geography and English during Term 3 to encourage R-11 KMS students to donate one item of non-perishable food which will be used at the local Anglicare Emergency Pantry in Wallaroo.

For more than 150 years, Anglicare SA has supported South Australians in need through diverse programs including parenting, youth, foster care, Aboriginal services, disability care, homelessness, and emergency assistance. The KMS Food Drive will help raise awareness and promote community support for those less fortunate, especially those who are in need of food. This as an important annual event, maintaining the strong ties between Kadina Memorial School and the local community.

Yr 9 students will visit R-6 classes in the upcoming weeks to promote the event. Each class will see a short video and hear from the Yr 9 students about the issue of access to food in the local community. The KMSC will be promoting the event to the Middle and Senior School and we hope that all students are motivated to help out and support those in need.

Students will be encouraged to donate one item of non-perishable food during Week 4 of this term. Please note that this request is optional, and your child is not obliged to participate. Food can be placed in classroom boxes during Week 4, with boxes being collected at the end of the week. Popular food items include:

- Cereal
- Canned soup
- Baby food



Yr 9 students have visited R-6 classes this week to promote the event. Each class has also seen a short video and heard from the Yr 9 students about the issue of access to food in the local community. The KMSC will be promoting the event to the Middle and Senior School and we hope that all students are motivated to help out and support those in need.

This was a Primary KMSC initiative.






