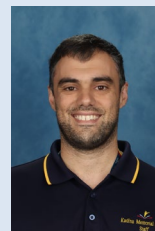

## Year 11 Building and Construction Cubby House Build

Year 11 Building and Construction students have again been involved in the construction of cubby houses this year. Students, under the guidance of teachers, constructed 3 'dwellings'. We are grateful to Kadina Stratco for the generous donation of colourbond sheets used for cladding the walls.

All students have benefitted from learning new and improved skills. Using the cubby construction as a focus has enabled us to study aspects of construction such as site preparation, levels, carpentry, safe material handling and preparation, measuring and marking, hand and power tool use, and teamwork.

A challenge each year is being able to make them in such a way that they can be flat packed for transport. This meant that some extra care and thought had to go into fastening. As part of their assessments students had to design a model of their own cubby house for a particular client. Through this work most students discovered many more challenges which demanded some good problem solving and interesting solutions.
