High Achieving SACE results – Kadina Memorial School

The 'Class of 2023' achieved outstanding South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) results, with 25% in the A grade bands. Eight Year 12 students achieved an Australian Tertiary Admissions Ranking (ATAR) of over 90 (raw score).

Congratulations to Year 12 Dux – Southwood Medalist - Vaughan Stonestreet who achieved an impressive 99.55 ATAR, with Charlee Hunter Runner Up Dux, achieving 95.45.

Vaughan Stonestreet was one of 1,120 Students who received a Governor of South Australia Commendation Award in 2023. He was nominated for this award due to his successful year in 2022 where he achieved an A+ for Music Performance Solo, his incredibly high raw ATAR score from 2023 of 99.55 and his continued Service and SACE Capabilities demonstrated at an exceptional level. This award recognised the excellent achievement in Year 12 subjects as well as success in developing the SACE capabilities of Literacy, Numeracy, Information and Technology Capability, Creative and Critical Thinking, Personal and Social Capability, Ethical Understanding, and Intercultural Understanding.

WELCOME TO 2024!

Kadina Memorial School has a vibrant and exciting Arts Department which includes Creative Arts (Mrs. Jacq Barry, Mr. Luke Atkinson), Drama (Mr. Andre Starr), Visual Art (Ms. Karen George), Music (Mr. Sandy Hahn), R-6 Arts (Mr. Ben Graefe) and our continuing Instrumental Music teacher, Kerrin Williams. Guitar, Percussion and Voice teachers are yet to be confirmed.

At Kadina Memorial School we offer all Reception to Year 6 students a yearlong Performing Arts program that includes learning skills from Drama, Media, Music and Dance. We also offer the opportunity for students to join our Year 5/6 Choir and perform at The Festival Theatre and East of the Rangers which are part of the Festival of Music. Year 4 students have the opportunity to be part of the Recorder Group and both ensembles are led by Mr. Ben Graefe.

The school also has a growing and exciting Instrumental Music Program with this year over 100 students learning Woodwind, Brass, Percussion, Guitar and Senior Voice from years 5 to 12. Students attend free instrumental weekly lessons with specialist teachers online (Guitar, Percussion and Voice) and face to face with Kerrin Williams.

2023 Year 9 Canberra Camp

64 Year 9 students and 7 staff attended the Canberra Camp in week 9 in term 4, 2023, our first one since COVID times. We left on Sunday afternoon and travelled all night to arrive in Canberra about 10am. On Monday we explored the city centre and visited the National Capital Exhibition Centre. Here we learnt about the design of Canberra, why the location was chosen, how it was named and also discovered some of the crazy suggestions for names for our nation's capital. On our way back to our accommodation we took a drive to the top of Mount Ainslie to get an overall view of Canberra.

On Tuesday we started at the War Memorial. Disappointingly the Memorial is currently under renovation, so we were granted only a short but very informative visit about World War 1. We then headed to the National Library of Australia and learnt about how the National Library can help our studies and learnt how they moved things about the library prior to email. In the afternoon we split into two groups to visit our next two destinations. Our visit to the High Court of Australia was very interesting as we were able to sit in on an actual case - and for those of you who didn't think it possible - Year 9's can 'actually' be silent for 10 minutes! The day finished with a visit to the National Museum of Australia and that evening we went to the cinema.

An early start on Wednesday to the Museum of Australia Democracy (Old Parliament House) where students were involved in a role play. We also went to the Royal Australian Mint and enjoyed a tour of how our money is made. The tour guide told us that we were the best Year 9 group for the year. After lunch we enjoyed a visit to Questacon and ended the day at Parliament House. We enjoyed ice-cream at Parliament House which was very much appreciated due to the muggy weather.

Our final day on Thursday we toured the Australian Institute of Sport and spent an hour in their interactive space where we tested our skills against elite athletes. We managed to squeeze in a visit to the National Arboretum to see an amazing display of bonsai trees - here we also found some lovely lush green hills to roll down as well. After lunch we visited the National Gallery of Australia and did a bus tour through Duntroon as well as the Embassy's.

We arrived back in Kadina at 6.30am on Friday morning. A little weary but with much more knowledge about our nation's capital.

To help lower the cost of a visit to our nation's capital we were able to apply for the PACER rebate. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government contributed funding per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards the cost of the camp. The rebate is paid directly to our school upon completion of the camp.

Our accommodation at Lumeah Lodge was fantastic, as were the meals that they supplied. Many thanks to the staff that supported the camp (both on it and back at school) and to the Year 9s that attended - you were a lot of fun to take a way. Looking for to another camp at the end of 2024.
